

#### INTRODUCTION

It is a pleasure to introduce the 26 <sup>th</sup> *Nature in Eurobodalla*, a report on the status of the fauna of the Eurobodalla Shire compiled from records submitted to the Eurobodalla Natural History Society during 2011. A map of the Shire is reproduced inside the front cover and a list of place name abbreviations used appears on the back page.

Weather-wise 2011 was unexceptional, with rainfall across the Eurobodalla very close to the long term average. Heavy rains in March resulted in some localised flooding, and regular rains throughout the year kept wetland levels high, the landscape green and forest and bushland flourishing. March was generally the wettest month with 244mm at Comerang, and 201mm at Mystery Bay, although Burrewarra Point had its highest monthly total, 166mm, in November. May was the driest month with 4.5mm at Moruya and 5mm at Comerang.

Each year we seem to receive reports of rare and unusual species and 2011 was no exception. Regent Honeyeaters at Congo in January, a Cape Barren Goose at Tuross estuary in March, a Black-tailed Native Hen at Comerang in November and a Red-backed Button-quail at Mogendoura in November were amongst the highlights for the birds. Notable amongst the butterflies and moths were Yellow-spotted and Scarlet Jezebel and Glasswing (none of which had appeared in our records before), and a Bent-wing Ghost Moth at Meringo, a new southern limit for this species. There was also the first record of the Eastern Sedgefrog for the Shire.

As always the records reflect the distribution of observers and their interests as much as the distribution of the fauna. Whilst the coastal strip from Durras to Bermagui is well covered, records for the forested areas in the west of the Shire are less comprehensive, mainly coming from occasional field excursions to these areas. In addition no off-shore field trips were undertaken during the year and records of pelagic species are therefore primarily from land-based observations. Despite these shortcomings the records do provide a very valuable qualitative assessment of the status of species in the Shire, enabling trends over the years to be evaluated.

As in previous years, the vertebrate taxonomic sequence basically follows Clayton *et al* (2006), however the listing of birds has been reordered to

follow the BirdLife Australia checklist based on Christides and Boles (2008).

Once again, our thanks go out to all contributors who have made this report possible. A complete list of those who have contributed their observations during the year appears on the final page. Special thanks go to Mandy Anderson, Mike Crowley and Gillian Macnamara for their assistance in collating sections of the records and to Phil Kingston *et al* for the Annual Assessment of Shearwater Breeding on Montagu Island.

### **BIRDS**

#### CASUARIIDAE Emu

Emu Dromaius novaehollandiae

Status: introduced to Horse Is in 1993, small wild population now established at TS estuary.

Twelve at TS estuary on 15 Nov, 7 on 29 Nov, 6 on 31 Jan, 4 on 11 Oct, 1 Nov, 2 on 12 Jul, 29 Aug; 1 at PP on 20 Dec. No breeding recorded.

### PHASIANIDAE Quail, pheasants.

### Stubble Quail Coturnix pectoralis

Status: uncommon breeding resident.

Forty at Com in Dec, 30 in Nov, 10-12 in other months; 1 at Belowra on 17 Feb; 1 at Pedro on 19 Jul.

Breeding: juveniles at Com in Dec. (JC)

### Brown Quail Coturnix ypsilophora

Status: uncommon breeding resident.

Two at Com every month except Jul; 6 at TS in Jun-Jul, Oct; 6 at Pedro on 14 Aug, 1 in Sep; 4 at Bergalia on 20 Feb. No breeding recorded.

### ANATIDAE Swan, ducks

### Musk Duck Biziura lobata

Status: uncommon breeding resident.

Four at OMBS on 12 Mar; 3 at Coopers Is on 29 Mar; 1 at Deep Ck Dam on 22 May; at BI on 26 June. No breeding recorded.

#### Freckled Duck Stictonetta naevosa

Status: Vulnerable (NSW Schedule 2); rare vagrant.

No records, last recorded in 2005.

## Cape Barren Goose Cereopsis novaehollandiae

Status: rare vagrant.

Juvenile at TS estuary in Mar, first sighting in the Shire. (P Gray)

## Black Swan Cygnus atratus

Status: common breeding resident and bird of passage; plentiful on large open waters, small groups or pairs on swamps, farm dams.

Widely reported throughout the year; 100 at Kianga on 5 April; at MHS in Jun; 90 at WL Nov-Dec, 60 in Feb; 80 at TS estuary on 22 Feb, 60 on 31 Jan, 53 on 28 Jun; 77 at TS River on 12 April; 60 at Surfside in Apr, 40 in Jan, Mar; 42 at SB on 8 May; 30 at Nangudga L on 9 Jan; no more

than 25 at other locations.

Breeding: nesting in Mar-Apr, Aug; cygnets in Apr-Jun, Aug-Nov; juveniles in Jan, May, Jul, Aug, Oct.

#### Australian Shelduck Tadorna tadornoides

Status: uncommon vagrant.

Eight at Com on 17 Nov, 1 or 2 occasionally in Sep-Oct, Dec; 2 at TS on 18 Jan; 1 at Coopers Is on 23 Mar.

### Australian Wood Duck Chenonetta jubata

Status: common breeding resident; widespread on wetlands, lakes, dams. Widely reported throughout the year: 150 at Com in Sep, 30-120 in other months; 120 at MYA in Jun, 30-50 in other months; 80 at Trunketabella on 13 Oct, 38 on 16 May; 50 at Eurobodalla Rd on 25 Jan; at NP in Jan; no more than 40 at other locations.

Breeding: dependent young in Jan-Mar, May, Oct-Nov.

#### Pink-eared Duck Malacorhynchus membranaceus

Status: rare vagrant.

No records, last recorded in 2009.

#### **Australasian Shoveler** *Anas rhynchotis*

Status: uncommon winter migrant; has bred.

Five at Coopers Is on 29 Aug; 3 at Central Farm on 10 Sep; 3 at Com on 29 Aug, 2 in Sep-Oct; 2 at TS River on 16 May. No breeding recorded.

### Grey Teal Anas gracilis

Status: breeding resident.

Thirty at Com in Oct, 10-20 in other months; 30 at Trunketabella on 13 Oct; 20 at PS in Nov; 16 at BI on 8 Jun; 14 at DS in Sep-Oct; 10 at TS River on 16 May; at MYA on 23 Oct; no more than 6 at other locations. Breeding: dependent young at Com in Feb, Oct. (JC)

#### Chestnut Teal Anas castanea

Status: common breeding resident; widespread on lakes, wetlands, ponds. Widely reported throughout the year: 150 at Com in Oct, 120 in Apr, 100 in Jun, 10-80 in other months; 100 at OMBS on 12 Mar; at Central Farm on 10 Sep; 100 at DS on 28 Aug, 70 on 16 Sep; 60 at Trunketabella on 22 Sep, 50 on 27 Nov; 50 at Bingie on 28 Aug; no more than 40 at other locations.

Breeding: dependent young at Com in May, Oct; at BP in Oct. (JC/JW)

### Northern Mallard Anas platyrhynchos

Status: uncommon vagrant.

No records, last recorded in 2009.

#### Pacific Black Duck Anas superciliosa

Status: common breeding resident; widespread on lakes, wetlands. Widely reported throughout the year: 150 at Com in Jun, 120 in May, 50-100 in Mar-Apr, Jul-Dec, 20 in Jan-Feb; 50 at Central Farm on 10 Sep; 50 at PS in Nov, 35 in Dec; 30 at Coopers Is on 14 May; less than 15 at other locations.

Breeding: dependent young at Com in Mar, Oct. (JC)

#### Hardhead Aythya australis

Status: common resident and bird of passage.

Maximum of 80 at Com in Oct-Nov, 40 in Jun, Aug-Sep, 2-14 in May, Jul, Dec; 16 at BI on 17 May, 5 on 8 Jun; 3 at Bevian Rd on 9 Apr; 2 at Central Farm on 10 Sep; 1 at MYA on 23 Oct. No breeding recorded.

#### **PODICIPEDIDAE** Grebes

## Australasian Grebe Tachybaptus novaehollandiae

Status: common breeding resident; widespread on wetlands, lakes, dams. Twenty to thirty at Com in Jul-Aug, 10-15 in Mar-Jun, Sep-Oct; 20 at OMBS on 12 Mar; 12 at Coila L in June; 11 at TS on 1 July; no more than 8 at other locations.

Breeding: nest at Com in Nov; dependent young in Dec. (JC)

### Hoary-headed Grebe Poliocephalus poliocephalus

Status: resident.

Eight at Coopers Is on 14 May; singles at TS River in Feb, at PS on 23 Mar, at Com on 25 Mar.

## **Great Crested Grebe** *Podiceps cristatus*

Status: rare vagrant.

No records, last recorded in 2009.

### **COLUMBIDAE** Pigeons, doves

Rock Dove Columba livia

Status: breeding resident.

Established colonies at BB, MYA, NA, TS River bridge; maxima: 60 at MYA in Aug, 30 at BB in Jun; at NA in Jul; at TS River in Mar; recorded at Surfside in Mar, Com in Aug, Broulee in Dec. No breeding recorded.

### White-headed Pigeon Columba leucomela

Status: breeding resident.

Widely recorded in all months: 18 at NA on 21 Mar; 18 at MKS in Oct, 15 in Dec; 16 at Pedro in Jul, Dec; 12 at TS in May-Jun; 7 at MHS on 26 Aug: 6 at Coile Lean 25 Jul; no more than 5 at other legations.

Aug; 6 at Coila L on 25 Jul; no more than 5 at other locations.

Breeding: nesting at TS in Jun; dependent young in Mar; juvenile in Feb. (JH/GR/WN)

### **Spotted Dove** *Streptopelia chinensis*

Status: breeding resident.

Two at TS in all months except Aug-Sep; 1-4 at MB in Jan-Feb, Jul-Dec; 1-4 at MYA in Jan-May; 5 at Broulee in Apr, 1 in Feb; 4 at Surfside in Jan, Mar; 2 at SB in Feb; 1 at Com in Apr.

Breeding: nesting at MB in Oct; juvenile in Dec. (MA/AC)

### Brown Cuckoo-Dove Macropygia amboinensis

Status: uncommon breeding resident and bird of passage.

Ten at Lilli Pilli on 23 Jul, 8 on 23 Jul; 1-2 or calls at MKS in Mar, Sep-Dec; 2 at NA on 15 Jul, 1 on 25 Feb; singles at Box Cutting on 12 May, at Broulee on 13 May, at TS in Sep, Nov. No breeding recorded.

### Common Bronzewing Phaps chalcoptera

Status: common breeding resident; widespread in woodland, forests. Widely recorded in all months, 1-4 at most locations; 12-24 at Pedro in all months; 10-20 at MKS in Jan-Apr, Aug-Dec; 10-20 at MYA in Oct-Dec; 4-8 at Com in all months; 7 at Bodalla in Jul, 6 in Sep; 6 at MB in Jun.

Breeding: nests at MKS in Jan, at Com in Aug; juvenile at PS in Dec. (SMG/JC/JM)

## **Brush Bronzewing** *Phaps elegans*

Status: uncommon breeding resident. No records.

## **Crested Pigeon** Ocyphaps lophotes

Status: common breeding resident.

Widely recorded in all months: 6-12 at Com throughout the year; 5-10 at MYA in most months; 12 at MB in Apr, at Barlings and TS in May, at NA in Aug; no more than 8 at other locations.

Breeding: dependent young at Surfside in Mar, at Com in Jul, Sep, Oct,

Dec. (DB/JC)

### Peaceful Dove Geopelia striata

Status: breeding resident.

One to five at PDD in Jan-Apr, Jun, Aug-Sep, Nov; 2 at Com in May, Nov, calls in Jun, Oct, Dec; 12 at Eurobodalla on 24 Jul; 5 at Coopers Is on 14 May; 2 at MB in Dec; calls at Bumbo Rd on 13 Aug; at MKS on 17 Oct.

Breeding: dependent young at MB in Dec. (EC)

### Bar-shouldered Dove Geopelia humeralis

Status: uncertain.

Three at Montagu Is on 30 Mar-1 Apr. (PF)

### Wonga Pigeon Leucosarcia picata

Status: common breeding resident; widespread in forest, woodland. Widely recorded in all months: 6 at MKS in Jan-Feb, 4 in Mar, Aug-Dec; 3-4 at MB most months; 7 at Bodalla SF on 28 Sep; 6 at Ringlands NA on 13 Nov, 4 on 7 May; 4 at Eurobodalla Rd on 25 Jan, at Gulaga on 5 Jun; 1-3 or calls at other locations.

Breeding: nests at MKS in Nov. (SMG)

### **Superb Fruit-Dove** *Ptilinopus superbus*

Status: Vulnerable (NSW Schedule 2); rare vagrant.

No records, last recorded in 2009.

## Rose-crowned Fruit-Dove Ptilinopus regina

Status: Vulnerable (NSW Schedule 2); rare vagrant.

No records, last recorded in 2006.

## **Topknot Pigeon** *Lopholaimus antarcticus*

Status: uncommon bird of passage.

Thirty at Bingie on 28 Aug; 16 at MHS on 2 Aug, 15 on 19 Jul; 13 at Pedro on 31 Mar, 2 on 31 Jan, 9 in Dec; 6 at PS on 2 Oct, at NA on 12 Nov, at Tilba L on 14 Dec; 5 at TS estuary on 5 Apr; 4 at Gulaga on 28 Sep; 3 at Coman's Mine on 18 Mar. No breeding recorded.

## **PODARGIDAE** Frogmouths

### Tawny Frogmouth Podargus strigoides

Status: uncommon breeding resident.

One at MB in Jan-Apr; 1-3 at TS in Jan-Feb, Apr, Nov-Dec; 5 at Sunshine Bay in Oct; 4 at PDD on 3 Dec; 2 at MKS on 20 Dec; calls at

MHS in Jan-Feb, at OMBS Mar-Apr, Sep, at MKS in Jan.

Breeding: young at TS in Apr, Dec, at Sunshine Bay in Oct, at PDD in

Dec. (JH/J Buckland/BA)

#### **EUROSTOPODIDAE** Nightjars

White-throated Nightjar Eurostopodus mystacalis

Status: uncommon summer-breeding migrant.

Calls at MKS in Jan, Oct, Dec; 1-3 or calls at PS in Jan-Feb, Oct-Dec; 2-4 at Pedro in Jan, Oct-Dec; 1 at Mummaga L in Feb; 1 at ERBG on 22 Mar; call at Womban on 24 Oct. No breeding recorded.

### **AEGOTHELIDAE** Owlet-nightjars

Australian Owlet-nightjar Aegotheles cristatus

Status: uncommon breeding resident.

One at Com in all months except July; 1 at NA on 29 May; 1 at Pedro in Sep; calls at PS in Jan-May, Sep, at MKS in Jan, Sep. No breeding recorded.

#### **APODIDAE** Swifts

## White-throated Needletail Hirundapus caudacutus

Status: summer migrant.

Widely reported Jan-Mar and Nov-Dec; hundreds at MHS on 11 and 24 Jan; 70 at PDD in Jan; 50 at PS on 19 Jan, at Pedro on 31 Jan; 100 at MKS on 1 Feb; 50 at Belowra on 17 Feb; 200 at CO on 27 Nov; 50 at PS on 26 Dec; less than 50 at other locations; last record 2 at PDD on 30 Mar; first return 3 at MKS on 29 Aug.

### Fork-tailed Swift Apus pacificus

Status: rare summer migrant.

No records.

#### **OCEANITIDAE** Storm-Petrels

Wilson's Storm-Petrel Oceanites oceanicus

Status: common pelagic.

No records.

### **Grey-backed Storm-Petrel** Garrodia nereis

Status: uncommon pelagic.

No records.

Ten off MHS on 5 Jul, 2 on 24 Jun; 4 off DS on 26 Jun, 1 on 20 Jun; 4 off BP in Jul, 1 on 28 Sep; 1 off BB on 24 Dec.

#### Shy Albatross Thalassarche cauta

Status: Vulnerable (NSW Schedule 2); common winter pelagic.

Four off MHS on 5 Jul, 1 on 24 Jun; 1 off DS on 26 Jun; 1 off BP in Jul.

### Yellow-nosed Albatross Thalassarche chlororhynchos

Status: common winter pelagic.

No records.

### Buller's Albatross Thalassarche bulleri

Status: uncommon winter pelagic.

No records.

### Light-mantled Sooty Albatross Phoebetria palpebrata

Status: rare pelagic, vagrant.

### PROCELLARIIDAE Petrels, shearwaters

Status: Endangered (NSW Schedule 1); common winter pelagic.

Status: Vulnerable (NSW Schedule 2); uncommon winter pelagic.

Status: common winter pelagic.

No records.

### Antarctic Prion Pachyptila desolata

Status: regular winter pelagic.

### Slender-billed Prion Pachyptila belcheri

Status: regular winter pelagic.

### Fairy Prion Pachyptila turtur

Status: common winter pelagic.

One beachcast at MB on 27 Feb, at Bengello on 28 Jul.

### White-chinned Petrel Procellaria aequinoctialis

Status: rare pelagic.

No records.

### Black Petrel Procellaria parkinsoni

Status: uncommon summer pelagic.

No records.

### Shearwater sp.

Twenty per minute flying north in a steady stream off BP on 23 Sep; hundreds moving south off MHS on 30 Oct; hundreds off Bingie on 13 Dec. (JW/JM/LG/PL)

### Wedge-tailed Shearwater Ardenna pacifica

Status: common resident and summer migrant, breeds on Montagu Is. One beachcast at MB on 27 Feb; a few hundred rafting at dusk off Montagu Is on 29 Mar, small numbers at sea off Montagu Is 29 Mar-1 Apr; thousands off MB on 4 Oct; recorded off BB on 24 Dec. Breeding: chicks at Montagu Is 29 Mar-1 Apr. (PF)

### Flesh-footed Shearwater Ardenna carneipes

Status: Vulnerable (NSW Schedule 2); common summer pelagic.

Recorded off BB on 24 Dec. (A Benson)

## Sooty Shearwater Ardenna grisea

Status: uncommon summer migrant, breeding on Montagu Is.

#### **Short-tailed Shearwater** Ardenna tenuirostris

Status: common summer migrant, breeds on Montagu Is.

Small numbers at sea off Montagu Is 29 Mar-1Apr, recorded off BB on 24 Dec.

Breeding: chicks at Montagu Is 29 Mar-1Apr. (PF)

#### Fluttering Shearwater Puffinus gavia

Status: common pelagic.

No records.

Status: uncommon pelagic.

Status: uncommon winter pelagic.

## **SPHENISCIDAE** Penguins

### Little Penguin Eudyptula minor

Status: common breeding resident; breeding Montagu Is, has bred at Tollgate Is and Jimmy's Is (Rosedale).

Two at Broulee on 19 Mar; 1 beachcast at TS on 26 Jun; calls at MHN on 18 Feb; present at Montagu Is 30 March-1April.

#### **SULIDAE** Gannets, boobies.

#### **Australasian Gannet** *Morus serrator*

Status: common winter migrant and bird of passage; present in all months in inshore waters, numbers rising in winter.

Recorded off BP in all months, peak of 600-700 on 8 Jul, 200 on 30 Jun, 2-60 in other months; 300 off TS in Jul, 50 in Jun; 40 in Oct; 100 off DS on 20 Jun; 47 off MHS on 24 Jun, 20 on 31 Oct; 25 of MO on 10 Oct; less than 10 at other locations.

### **Brown Booby** Sula leucogaster

Status: uncommon vagrant.

No records.

#### **ANHINGIDAE** Darter

### Australasian Darter Anhinga novaehollandiae

Status: breeding resident.

Five to nine at TS estuary in Nov, 1 or 2 in Jan-Feb, Jul, Oct, Dec; 2 at Coopers Is in Mar, May; singles at Com in Jan, Mar-Apr, Oct-Dec, at Coila L in May, Dec, at Bumbo Rd on 13 Aug, at MYA on 23 Oct, 24 Dec, at PDD on 17 Nov.

Breeding: dependent young at TS estuary in Jan-Feb, juvenile at Com in Nov-Dec. (GR/WN/JC)

#### **PHALACROCORACIDAE** Cormorants

### Little Pied Cormorant Microcarbo melanoleucos

Status: common breeding resident; widespread on coast, estuaries, ponds. Widely reported in all months: 117 at TS estuary on 12 Jul, 34 on 28 Jun, 32 on 1 Nov; 60 at DS in Sep, 30 in Aug, 22 on 18 May; 40 at Coila L on 28 Aug, 20 on 19 May; 30 at WL on 8 Dec, at Clyde River on 29 Aug; 22 at Pedro on 2 Dec; no more than 12 at other locations. No breeding recorded.

#### **Great Cormorant** *Phalacrocorax carbo*

Status: common resident; widespread on coast, estuaries, ponds, wetlands.

Widely reported in all months: 160 at WL on 8 Dec, 50 on 24 Nov; 120 at MB on 11 Oct, 70 on 27 Nov, 20-60 in Jan-Mar; 90 at Surfside on 8 Oct; 82 at BI on 11 Dec; 80 at MHS on 11 Oct; 50 at Com on 18 Oct, 25 in Mar; no more than 30 at other locations.

Breeding: juveniles at TS in Apr, at Com in Oct. (GR/WN/JC)

#### **Little Black Cormorant** *Phalacrocorax sulcirostris*

Status: common resident on coast, lakes, estuaries, wetlands. Up to 150 at TS in Dec, 100 in Jul, Sep, 50-70 in Jan-Feb, Jun; 100 at Coila L in Jun, 40 in May; 100 at Com on 31 Dec; 30 at MO on 14 Oct; 20 at DS in May, Sep; 15 at MYA on 10 Apr; no more than 10 at other locations.

Breeding: dependent young at TS on 31 Jan. (GR/WN)

#### Pied Cormorant Phalacrocorax varius

Status: uncommon resident.

Ten at WL on 9 Aug; 7 at TS estuary on 29 Nov, 5 on 31 Jan, 1-2 in Apr, Jun-Jul, Oct, Dec; 6 at MB on 8 Nov, 1 on 6 Aug; 6 overflying Bergalia in Nov; 4 at MYA on 19 Jan; fewer records and less widespread than recent years.

#### **PELECANIDAE** Pelican

## Australian Pelican Pelecanus conspicillatus

#### Rare Birds in the Eurobodalla 2011

In order to ensure accuracy in the Society's records, contributors reporting rare or unusual species are asked to complete an Unusual Record Report form and provide supporting evidence in the form of field notes and photographs. Where appropriate, observers are encouraged to submit their records to the New South Wales Ornithological Records Appraisal Committee and/or the Birds Australia Rarities Committee.

Below are the records of submissions made to the ENHS Committee of rare and unusual sightings during 2011, together with an adjudication by the Birds Australia Rarities Committee on a sighting in 2010.

# **Semipalmated Plover** *Charadrius semipalmatus*

# Red-backed Button-quail Turnix maculosus

One recorded at Hawdons Rd Mogendoura on 28 and 30 November 2011. Comprehensive field notes indicate an adult male. First record for the Eurobodalla.

The head of a crested penguin was found at Mystery Bay on 26

September 2011 by Christina Potts. Initial examination by Ken Simpson indicated that it was either a Fiordland or Snares Penguin. We are awaiting a positive identification of the bird.

# 53<sup>rd</sup> ANNUAL ASSESSMENT OF SHEARWATER BREEDING SUCCESS ON MONTAGU ISLAND, 27 MARCH – 3 APRIL 2012

The format of this report and the abbreviations used are consistent with those in previous annual reports (e.g. Davey *et al.* 2010). The study area on the south-eastern side of the smaller northern part of Montagu Island is known as NISA (293 m²); the two study areas at the northern end of the southern part are known as SISA (428 m²) and THISA (293 m²). Their position is shown on the maps in the report on the size of the shearwater breeding population on Montagu Island (Fullagar and Heyligers 1998). The bird records for the island have been reviewed by Fullagar (1989) but many subsequent records have been included in annual reports (similar to this one) dating back to 1998. Names of birds follow Christidis and Boles (2008); all other vertebrates follow Clayton *et al.* (2006). Names of butterflies follow Braby (2004) and moths follow Common (1990) while those of vascular plants follow those used by Heyligers and Adams (1989, 2004). See Davey *et al.* (2010) for a map showing the revegetation zones on the island and the area burnt in 2001.

### **Weather and Habitat Conditions**

We departed Narooma at 09:30 on 27 March, crossing to the island in moderate southerly wind with a 2 metre swell and overcast conditions. A few Short-tailed Shearwaters, one Fluttering Shearwater and several Australasian Gannets were seen during the crossing. Overcast conditions continued on the 27<sup>th</sup> and light rain fell that night and during the morning of the 28<sup>th</sup>, delaying the survey until after lunch. Drying conditions in the afternoon permitted work with a fresh NE wind. Thursday was fine and warm with light southerly winds all day. The 29<sup>th</sup>, 30<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> were fine and clear with light southerly conditions. A strong southerly change during the night produced overcast, windy conditions on 1 April that abated during the day before a thunderstorm brought a brief period of heavy rain late in the afternoon. It was fine and clear on the 2with virtually no wind or swell.

Rainfall figures (mm) for the twelve months April 2011 to the end of March 2012 are as follow: 80.2; 36.8; 38.4; 94.2; 84.6; 17.8; 59.6; 63.0; 33.6; 5.0; 197.2 and 170.2. The high monthly totals in February and

March included falls on three days (9–11 February) of 10.8; 77.6 and 27.6mm and another wet period of 6 days starting on 29 February amounted to a total of 121mm. Between 7 and 9 March many burrows were seen to be completely flooded with chicks on the surface. By 11 March no surface chicks were to be seen and fresh scratchings were obvious at many burrows (François van Zyl, NPWS, pers. comm.)

Due once again to an above average yearly rainfall the island appeared particularly lush with the Spiny-headed Matt-rush *Lomandra longifolia* in especially good condition on all study plots. Again we noted the intrusion of Running Postman *Kennedia rubicunda* spreading into SISA along the eastern border and Kikuyu Grass *Pennisetum clandestinum* continues to encroach along the northern border. The cliff face above the gulch here is now heavily infested despite being controlled a few years ago. The minor intrusion of Kikuyu Grass midway along the southern side of SISA is expanding. Running Postman and Kangaroo Apple *Solanum vescum* were widespread on NISA. Kangaroo Apple and Rambling Dock *Acetosa sagittata* were widespread on THISA but mostly as dead remnants. The soil this year was noticeably more compact, moist and dark leading to a far more stable substrate and a more consolidated burrow structure.

The successful re-introduction of native vegetation along the western side of the island is now forming dense shrubland with emergent Eucalypts and Banksias providing the early stages of a forest structure. Much of the tall Coastal Wattle *Acacia longifolia* var. *sophorae* along the pathway east of this area is now reaching senility and dying. Kikuyu eradication and revegetation of areas 7 and 8 has occurred.

# Coverage

We started work on THISA at 12:50 on the 27 th and finished this plot by 15:10 the same day. We then started work on SISA at 15:30 finishing for the day at 16:30. On 28March wet conditions delayed us continuing work on SISA until 13:00 and we completed this plot at 18:15. We began work on NISA at 10:00 on 29 March and finished at 16:20 that day.

Both islands were covered over the course of our stay.

# **Survey Results**

The results of this year's survey, together with those for 2011, are summarised in Table 1.

More burrows and more chicks were found on the plots than in 2011. The percentage of occupied burrows was exactly on the 45% rule (see Fullagar *et al.* 2004). Unusually, we found several chicks on the surface under cover and these were found not only on the study plots but elsewhere in the colonies. Three burrows on SISA certainly held chicks but they were too deep and difficult to extract. An appropriate adjustment to the total for this site has been made to include them.

Numbers of Wedge-tailed Shearwater *Ardenna pacifica* were higher than in 2011 on all three study plots. Weights were higher than those measured in 2011 (average of 446 g compared with 388 g). Weights ranged from 213–695 g, which was similar to the range found in previous years, despite the average being higher. Sixty-six Wedge-tailed Shearwaters chicks were in full down (moult score 5), two in moult score 4, two in moult 3 and one in moult 2.

Short-tailed Shearwater *Ardenna tenuirostris* chick numbers were significantly higher on two plots than in 2011. Mean chick weight for this species was 595 g, which was similar to the mean weight in 2011 (604 g). Weights ranged from 340–999 g. Eighty-four chicks were in full down, nine in moult score 4, six in moult 3 and thirteen in moult 2. This gives an overall figure of 25% of chicks no longer in full down.

Chick densities were 700 chicks/ha for Wedge-tailed Shearwaters and 1105 chicks/ha for Short-tailed Shearwaters, giving an overall shearwater density from the plots of 1834 chicks/ha. Burrow density was 4103

burrows/ha.

No Sooty Shearwater Ardenna grisea chicks were found this year.

#### General

**Birds** 

**Stubble Quail** *Coturnix pectoralis.* Several coveys were seen in various places on all days -4, 4, 2, 3 and 3– all possibly different groups.

**Bar-shouldered Dove** *Geopelia humeralis*. Two present on the island in an area of regrowth on the W side of south island.

**Black-browed Albatross** *Thalassarche melanophrys*. One adult seen with a Yellow-nosed Albatross on the sea W of the island early morning on 2 April (see next entry).

**Yellow-nosed Albatross** *Thalassarche chlororhynchos carteri*. One immature going S off W side of island on 1 April and another or the same immature seen off W side early 2 April alongside a Black-browed Albatross. Both were being harassed several times by a juvenile White-breasted Sea-eagle swooping onto them to which they responded by snapping in defence.

**Wedge-tailed Shearwater** Ardenna pacifica and **Short-tailed Shearwater** A. tenuirostris. See text above. Only small numbers of Short-tailed Shearwater seen at sea when crossing to the island on 27 March and little activity noted at night.

**Fluttering Shearwater** *Puffinus gavia*. One seen during crossing to the island on 27 March.

**Little Penguin** *Eudyptula minor*. Little activity ashore. No counts made of birds coming ashore in the evenings. Some observed moulting and few were heard calling at night. The carcase of a penguin banded on the island by Nick Klomp on 29 November 2003 was recovered. The bird was an adult when banded. Time between banding and recovery was 8 years 3 months and 27 days.

**Australasian Gannet** *Morus serrator*. A few observed (1–10) at sea all days, predominantly adults.

**Great Cormorant** *Phalacrocorax carbo*. Seen every day with maximum 16 roosting on rocks on W side of south island on 30 March.

**Little Black Cormorant** *Phalacrocorax sulcirostris*. Seen every day with maximum 16 roosting on rocks on W side of south island on 30 March.

Pied Cormorant Phalacrocorax varius. One seen flying S at sea off

Narooma Bar during crossing to the island on 27 March.

**White-faced Heron** *Egretta novaehollandiae*. Seen every day with maximum of three at any one time.

**Eastern Reef Egret** *Egretta sacra*. One dark morph on 30 March N of jetty and again here on 2 April.

White-bellied Sea-eagle Haliaeetus leucogaster. Two adults, two juveniles and one sub-adult seen at various times on all days. See also note under Yellow-nosed Albatross.

**Swamp Harrier** *Circus approximans*. Female on 28 and 31 March at S end of south island and again on 1 April working the S and W side of the island.

Nankeen Kestrel Falco cenchroides. A pair seen on all days.

**Peregrine Falcon** *Falco peregrinus*. A pair observed on all days. Always on north island.

**Buff-banded Rail** *Gallirallus philippensis*. Particularly common this trip – seen on all days, mostly along the track and in open areas. Often up to 4 or more together. Numbers on the island must be in the order of 50+.

**Sooty Oystercatcher** *Haematopus fuliginosus*. Few seen. Maximum of 9 seen.

**Caspian Tern** *Hydroprogne caspia*. Only one seen 28–30 March W of the gulch and near jetty.

**Crested Tern** *Thalasseus bergii*. Very few seen at sea and some roosting on shore most days.

**Silver Gull** *Chroicocephalus novaehollandiae.* Very few at sea and around island. A few late-hatched juveniles still roaming near the north landing and near the light station – as was the situation last year.

**Yellow-faced Honeyeater** *Lichenostomus chrysops*. Seen all days in low numbers (up to 10), mainly in Acacia thickets on SW and W side of south island (2001 burnt area). Nest recovered from this area (Boyd Hastings,

NPWS, pers. comm.). First positive indication of breeding on the island.

**Golden Whistler** *Pachycephalus pectoralis*. One female seen on 28 March.

**Grey Fantail** *Rhipidura albiscapa*. Two on 28<sup>th</sup> and one on 30 March in thicket on the W side of south island.

**Australian Raven** *Corvus coronoides*. One adult calling from top of lighthouse tower 1 April.

**Golden-headed Cisticola** *Cisticola exilis*. Not vocal and difficult to detect but a few birds seen some days.

**Little Grassbird** *Megalurus gramineus*. Inconspicuous at this time of the year but some seen most days.

**Silvereye** *Zosterops lateralis*. Present in low numbers on all days and mostly in the thickets along the W side of south island.

**Welcome Swallow** *Hirundo neoxena*. Seen all days. Maximum number of 17 on 1 April but some birds may be passing through.

**Starling** *Sternus vulgaris.* One seen at light station on 1 and 2 April. **Australasian Pipit** *Anthus novaeseelandiae.* One seen on grassy lawn W of light station in the late afternoon of 1 April and again the following

of light station in the late afternoon of 1 April and agmorning.

#### Mammals

**Seals** No overall count of seals was made this year but a group of up to 6 **New Zealand Fur Seal** *Arctocephalus forsteri* often seen on rocks offshore to the SW of south island and on rocks out from south landing. Many seals were seen to be loafing on the rocky shoreline along the NW side of north island with an estimate of 300, all presumed to be of this same species, on 31 March.

### Reptiles

**Green Turtle** *Chelonia mydas*. One seen close to south landing on 30 March.

White's Skink Ergenia whitii. Observed regularly and throughout the island.

**Grass Sun-skink** *Lampropholis guichenoti*. Observed regularly and throughout the island.

# Lepidoptera

**Hesperid skippers.** One unidentified individual seen which may have been the **White-brand Grass-skipper** *Toxidia reitmanni*.

**Chequered Swallowtail** *Papilio demoleus*. One seen 31 March passing N to the W of the light station.

Spotted Jezabel Delias agnippe. One seen on 28 March

Cabbage White Pieris rapae. A few seen in regrowth patches most days.

Common Brown Heteronympha merope. A few seen most days.

**Common Grass-blue** *Zizina labradus*. A few seen along pathways some days.

A small white moth, *Utetheisa sp.*, previously recorded from the island, was again seen on 1 April.

Arachnids

Two Wolf Spiders Lycosa godeffroyi. Seen in lighthouse buildings.
