

#### INTRODUCTION

It is a pleasure to introduce this thirty first edition of *Nature in Eurobodalla*, a report on the status of the fauna of the Eurobodalla Shire compiled from records submitted to the Eurobodalla Natural History Society during 2016. A map of the Shire is reproduced inside the front cover and a list of place name abbreviations used in the text appears inside the back cover.

Globally 2016 was the warmest year on record and the first six months of the year were the warmest on record for NSW, whilst December was the second warmest. This produced a number of temperature records in the Shire, mainly due to warmer nights (higher than average minimum temperatures) rather than hot days. In December Batemans Bay and Narooma both recorded their highest ever overnight minimum whilst Moruya had its highest since 1907.

Rainfall across the Shire was close to average, with the Bureau of Meteorology stations recording 911mm at Moruya Heads (5% above average), 1024mm at Narooma (12% above average) and 859 at Montagu Island (2% below average). January and June were especially wet, with 358mm at Coolagolite and 356mm at Moruya in January and 395 at Coolagolite and 341mm at Comerang in June. Weather stations at Narooma and Nelligen both recorded their wettest day on record on 6 June. May and August were the driest months with 6.5mm at Moruya in May and 7mm at Comerang in Aug.

During the year members of the Society again participated in the NSW Parks and Wildlife shorebird monitoring programs and in BirdLife Australia surveys for Swift Parrot. The latter provided valuable additional records from the forested areas in the west of the Shire. No off-shore field trip were undertaken during the year and records of pelagic species are therefore primarily from land-based observations.

Whilst no species of vertebrate new to the Shire were recorded in 2016, we did receive the first records of one butterfly – the Striped Xenica (*Oreixenica kershawi*) - and two species of Peacock spider *Maratus splendens* and *Maratus volans*. Some species not seen for many years were also recorded: a Black-tailed Godwit at Brou Lake in December

was only the second record for the species, the previous sighting being in 1992, whilst a Yellow-bellied Seasnake at Bingie in October was the first since 1995 and only the third record for the species. In addition a Rose-crowned Fruit-dove at Lilli Pilli in May was the first since 2002 and a Broad-billed Sandpiper at Tuross in February and Superb Fruit-dove at Cullendulla Creek in May were both the first since 2009.

The absence of sightings can sometimes be as interesting as their presence and a notable absentee in 2016 was the White-winged Triller. Although never common, the species has been reported in the months of January to March and August to December in most years, the last time it failed to appear in the records was in 2003.

This report is restricted to those species recorded during the year; species not recorded are not listed. An annotated list of all bird species recorded in the Eurobodalla since the inception of the Society in 1986 is available on the Society's website (www.enhs.org.au) and is updated annually to reflect new sightings. As noted in previous years, the records reflect the distribution of observers and their interests as much as the distribution of the fauna. However, despite these shortcomings the records provide a valuable qualitative assessment of the status of species in the Shire, enabling trends over the years to be evaluated.

As in other recent years, the vertebrate taxonomic sequence basically follows Clayton *et al* (2006), with the listing of birds following the BirdLife Australia checklist based on Christides and Boles (2008). Taxonomic references used in compiling this report are listed below.

Once again, my thanks go out to all contributors who have made this report possible. In particular I thank my co-complier, Julie Morgan, for her work as the Society's Recorder during the year. Thanks also to David Priddel *et al* for the 58<sup>th</sup> Annual Assessment of Shearwater Breeding on Montagu Island. A complete list of those who have contributed their observations during the year appears on the final page.

# Black Swan Cygnus atratus

Status: common breeding resident and bird of passage.

Widely reported throughout the year; up to 350 at Brou L in Dec; 250 at MHS in Apr, 200 in Mar, May and Jul-Aug; 65 at MYA in Jul; 60 at Com in Jun-Jul; 50 at MB in Jul; 35 at WL in Aug; 34 at Clyde R NP in Apr; no more than 25 at other locations.

Breeding: cygnets at MYA in Aug. (FM)

# Australian Shelduck Tadorna tadornoides

Status: vagrant.

Two at Com in Jun-Aug, 1 in Feb and Apr-May. (JC)

# Australian Wood Duck Chenonetta jubata

Status: common breeding resident.

Widely reported throughout the year; 150 at Com in Mar, 50-120 in other months; 40 at Kianga in May; 35 at MB in Apr; 30 at Bergalia and Coila L in Mar; 26 at Coila Ck in Nov; no more than 20 at other locations.

Breeding: dependent young in Oct-Dec.

#### Pink-eared Duck Malacorhynchus membranaceus

Status: vagrant.

Up to 80 at Com in Jan, 60 in May-Jun, 20-30 in Mar-Apr and Jul. (JC)

## **Australasian Shoveler** *Anas rhynchotis*

Status: uncommon winter migrant, has bred.

Up to 40 at Com in Mar, 20 in Apr-Jun, 8-10 in Jan-Feb and Jul; 1 at MYA in Jul. (JC/JM)

## **Grey Teal** Anas gracilis

Status: breeding resident.

Reported throughout the year; 70 at Com in Sep, 50 in May and Jul-Aug, 10-30 in other months; 9 at NA in Jun, at MYA in Jul; 8 at MO in Apr; no more than 2 at other locations.

Breeding: dependent young at Com in Sep. (JC)

#### Chestnut Teal Anas castanea

Status: common breeding resident.

Widely reported throughout the year; 150 at Com in May, 100-120 in Jan-Feb and Jun-Aug; 80 at Trunketabella in Mar, at Kianga in May; 32 at MB in Feb; 30 at MO in Mar and at Coila L in Nov; 22 at MYA in Jul; no more than 20 at other locations.

Breeding: dependent young at Com in Jan, Aug and Oct. (JC)

# Pacific Black Duck Anas superciliosa

Status: common breeding resident.

Widely reported throughout the year; up to 200 at Com in May, 100-150 in Jan-Apr and Jun-Aug; 20 at Eurobodalla Rd in Apr; 15 at Kianga in May; 6 at MB in Mar and Jul-Aug, at MO in Apr, at Bodalla in Jun and at Barlings Swamp in Oct; less than 5 at other locations.

# Hardhead Aythya australis

Status: common resident and bird of passage.

Five at Com in Jun, 1-2 in Feb-May; 1 at NA in May. (FM/JC/MA)

Status: common breeding resident.

Six at Com in Jun, 2-4 in other months; 4 at MO in Jul, at Long Swamp in Aug; 3 at BB in May; 2 at Eurobodalla Rd in Apr; 1 at ERBG in May and Barlings Swamp in Oct.

## Hoary-headed Grebe Poliocephalus poliocephalus

Status: breeding resident.

Twenty five at Com in Apr, 8 in May-Jun, 2-6 in Jan-Mar; 5 at MO in Jul, 2 in Apr, 1 in Jan; 2 at Long Swamp in Aug; 1 at Belowra in Apr.

#### **COLUMBIDAE** Pigeons, doves

Status: common breeding resident.

Established colonies at BB, MYA and NA; up to 50 at NA in Jun; 2 at Gulaga in Sep. (FM/MA)

## White-headed Pigeon Columba leucomela

Status: common breeding resident.

Widely recorded in all months; up to 20 at MKS in Jan and Sep; 14 at Pedro in Feb; 12 at BI in Jun; 10 at DY in May; 8 at TS in Mar, at MB in May and Aug; 7 at Lilli Pilli in Apr and Aug; fewer than 5 at other locations.

Breeding: nesting at MYA in Aug. (FM)

# **Spotted Dove** *Streptopelia chinensis*

Status: breeding resident.

Six at MB in Jun, 2-4 most other months; 5 at MYA in Apr, 1-3 in Jan-Mar; 2 at Kianga in Jan-Feb, at Broulee in Feb and Nov, at NA in Apr; 1 at DS in Jan, Oct and Dec, at Eurobodalla Rd in Apr and at Com in Dec.

# Brown Cuckoo-Dove Macropygia amboinensis

Status: uncommon breeding resident and bird of passage.

Twenty at MKS in Aug, 12 in Jul; 7 at Lilli Pilli in Jul, 6 in Aug; 5 at Coolagolite in Oct; 4 at DS in Jan; no more than 2 at other locations.

## **Emerald Dove** Chalcophaps indica

Status: vagrant.

One recorded at MB on 22 May. (MA)

## Common Bronzewing Phaps chalcoptera

Status: common breeding resident.

Widely recorded in all months; up to 20 at MKS in May and Jul; 12 at Pedro in Jan-Feb and Dec; 8 at Bergalia in Feb-Mar; 7 at Com in May-Jun; 5 at Coolagolite in Aug, at Bodalla in Oct; no more than 4 at other locations.

Breeding: nesting at MKS in Aug-Sep. (SMG)

# **Brush Bronzewing** *Phaps elegans*

Status: uncommon breeding resident.

Single birds recorded at Bodalla in Jan and Mar and at MO in Nov.

Status: common breeding resident.

Recorded in all months; up to 12 at Com in Jan, 2-10 in other months; 10 at Broulee in Aug, 8 in Feb; 6 at MB in Apr and Jun-Jul; 5 at MO in Apr; no more than 4 at other locations.

#### Peaceful Dove Geopelia striata

Status: breeding resident but becoming less common. Four at Com in Aug, calls in Jan, Sep and Nov-Dec. (JC)

#### **Bar-shouldered Dove** Geopelia humeralis

Status: uncommon resident.

Five at Montagu Is in Mar; 1 at BP in Jan; calls at Cullendulla Ck in May and Jul. (DB/FM/JW/MC)

## Wonga Pigeon Leucosarcia picata

Status: common breeding resident.

Widely recorded in all months, 1-2 or calls at most locations; 20 at Bodalla SF in Sep; 10 at Gulaga in Sep, 5 in May; 8 at MB in Jun, 6 in Mar and Oct; 6 at NA in Apr, 5 in Mar; no more than 4 at other locations.

## **Superb Fruit-Dove** *Ptilinopus superbus*

Status: Vulnerable (NSW Schedule 2); vagrant.

## Rose-crowned Fruit-Dove Ptilinopus regina

Status: Vulnerable (NSW Schedule 2); vagrant.

Call at Cullendulla Ck on 17 May. (DB)

#### **Topknot Pigeon** *Lopholaimus antarcticus*

Status: bird of passage.

Thirty five at PS on 24 Dec, 30 in Jun; 25 at BI SF in Aug; 20 at Bingie in Jun, at MKS in Dec; 17 at MO in Nov; 8 at Pedro in Sep; 2 at Com in Oct; 1 at TS in Jan.

#### **PODARGIDAE** Frogmouths

Status: breeding resident.

Four at Pedro in Dec, 2 in Jun and Aug-Sep; 4 at MB in Dec; 2 at TS in Apr and Jun-Jul; 1 at MHS in Feb, at Com in Apr-May, at Coolagolite in Apr, at MO in Jul, at Gulaga in Sep; calls at MKS in Feb and Oct. Breeding: dependent young in Dec, juveniles in Jan and Dec. (JH/JS/MA)

#### **EUROSTOPODIDAE** Nightjars

## **AEGOTHELIDAE** Owlet-nightjars

## **Great Cormorant** *Phalacrocorax carbo*

Status: common resident.

Reported in all months; 55 overflying Bergalia in Jul; 30 at WL in Jan, at Coila L in Nov; 25 at MB in Dec; 20 at NA in Jul, at MO in Nov; 17 at Montagu Is in Mar; 15 at Brou L in Dec; fewer than 15 at other locations.

## Little Black Cormorant Phalacrocorax sulcirostris

Status: common resident.

Reported in all months; 40 at Coila L in Nov; 14 at DS in Dec; 10 at MB in May; 8 at Com in Jan, at Coila Ck in Nov; 7 at MO in Nov; no more than 6 at other locations.

Status: uncommon resident.

Four at Kianga in May, at Broulee in Sep; 3 at MO in Jan, 2 in Nov, 1 in Dec; 2 at MYA in May and Aug, at Coila L in May and Nov; 2 at WL in

Aug, 1 in Jan; 1 at MB in Feb and at NA in Feb-Mar.

## Eastern Great Egret Ardea modesta

Status: common resident.

Thirty two at Com on 14 Jan, 10 in Feb; 6 at WL in Aug; 4 at MB in Mar-May, Aug and Oct; no more than 3 at other locations.

## **Intermediate Egret** Ardea intermedia

Status: uncommon migrant.

Two at Com in Sep-Oct, 1 in Jan-Aug; 2 at MB in Mar, 1 in Feb; 1 at Mossy Pt in Apr.

## Cattle Egret Ardea ibis

Status: common autumn-spring migrant.

Recorded Mar-Nov; 150 at MYA in Jul, 50 in Sep; 60 at Com in Mar, 34 in Oct; 14 at MB in Apr; 8 at BI in Apr; 6 at Eurobodalla Rd in Apr and at Tilba in May; fewer than 5 at other locations.

#### **Striated Heron** Butorides striata

Status: uncommon breeding resident.

One recorded at MYA in Jul and Nov. (JC/JM)

## White-faced Heron Egretta novaehollandiae

Status: common breeding resident.

Widely reported in all months; 30 at Com in Jan-Feb, 20 in Mar and Jun-Aug; 25 at MB in May, 18 in Jul; 17 at Nangudga L in Aug, 13 in Mar; 12 at NA in May; 10 at Coila L in May and Nov, at Cullendulla Ck in Jul; fewer than 10 at other locations.

# Little Egret Egretta garzetta

Status: common resident.

Twelve at Nangudga L in Feb, 11 in Mar; 6 at MB in Mar, May, Jul-Aug and Oct; 5 at WL in Aug; 4 at Eurobodalla Rd in Apr; no more than 3 at other locations.

# Eastern Reef Egret Egretta sacra

Status: resident.

Three at MO in Nov, 2 in Dec; 2 at MB in Jan, Apr-Jun, Aug and Oct, at NA in May; singles at Bingie Pt in Jan-Apr, at WL in Jan, at Montagu Is in Mar, at Broulee Is, Cullendulla Ck and Wasp Head in Jul, at Long Beach in Oct, at Broulee and Coila L in Nov.

#### Nankeen Night Heron Nycticorax caledonicus

Status: uncommon breeding resident.

One recorded at Bumbo Ck on 9 Feb. (MA)

## THRESKIORNITHIDAE Ibises, spoonbills

# Straw-necked Ibis Threskiornis spinicollis

Status: winter-spring migrant and bird of passage.

Up to 250 at Com in Apr, 200 in Jun-Jul; 250 at Trunketabella in Jul; 150 at MO in Apr; 120 at MYA in Jul, 100 in Aug; 60 at Eurobodalla Rd in Apr; 40 at Coila L in Mar; fewer than 15 at other locations.

## Royal Spoonbill Platalea regia

Status: common resident.

Up to 42 at Com in Jan, 26 in Feb, 22 in Jun; 26 at NA in Jun and at MB in Aug; 17 at WL in Aug; 13 at MYA in Sep; no more than 10 at other locations.

# **ACCIPITRIDAE** Osprey, kites, eagles, harriers, goshawks

Eastern Osprey Pandion cristatus

Status: Vulnerable (NSW Schedule 2); uncommon migrant.

Two at BB and Cullendulla Ck in May, 1 in Nov; 1 at NA in Feb-Mar and May, at TS in Feb and at Pedro Pt in Dec.

Breeding: nest building at BB in May. (JM/PHH/RS)

#### **Black-shouldered Kite** *Elanus axillaris*

Status: breeding resident.

Recorded in all months; 2 at MO and MB in Jul, at MYA in Nov and at Com in Nov-Dec; 1 at Bergalia most months, at MO in Mar, Jul, and Nov-Dec, at Eurobodalla Rd in Apr, at Kianga in May, at WL in Aug and at Trunketabella in Oct.

Breeding: juvenile at Com in Feb. (JC)

## **Square-tailed Kite** *Lophoictinia isura*

Status: Vulnerable (NSW Schedule 2); uncommon spring-summer breeding migrant.

Singles at MB in Jan, Mar and Dec, at MKS in Jan, Aug and Dec, at PS in Feb, Aug, Oct and Dec, at Broulee in Aug, at Bodalla SF in Sep, at Coolagolite and MO in Dec.

## White-bellied Sea-Eagle Haliaeetus leucogaster

Status: Vulnerable (NSW Schedule 2); common breeding resident. Widely reported throughout the year; 6 at Montagu Is in Mar; 5 at NA in May; 4 at MB in May-Jun, Aug, Oct and Dec, at MO in Jul and at Com in Sep; no more than 3 at other locations.

Breeding: juveniles and immatures reported year round.

#### Whistling Kite Haliastur sphenurus

Status: breeding resident.

Reported in all months; 4 at NA in May; 3 at Com in May and Sep-Dec, at MB in Jun and Dec; no more than 2 at other locations.

Breeding: nesting at Com in Jul-Aug, dependent young in Sep-Dec. (JC)

## Brown Goshawk Accipiter fasciatus

Status: breeding resident.

## 58th ANNUAL ASSESSMENT OF SHEARWATER BREEDING SUCCESS ON MONTAGU ISLAND, 24–29 MARCH 2017

The format of this report and the abbreviations used are consistent with those in previous annual reports (e.g. Crowley *et al.* 2016). Montagu Island is divided into two parts by a steep gulch and a beach that is passable at all tides. We refer to these two portions as north island and south island. Replanting of the south island with taller vegetation, using plants know to have occurred on the island in the past, has occurred following systematic control of Kikuyu Grass *Pennisetum clandestinum*. This has been done progressively over the last 16 years across designated zones, and these zones (numbered 1-9 or assigned as Asset A, B or C and Accidental) are used in this report for reference purposes. They are briefly described (condition in March 2013) and shown in a map in Fullagar *et al.* (2012).

Our shearwater colony study site on the SE side of the smaller northern part of Montagu Island (zone 9) is known as NISA (293 m²); the two study sites at the northern end of the southern part are known as SISA (428 m²) and ThiSA (293 m²), located at the N end of zone 8. The location of these study sites is shown in Fullagar & Heyligers (2006). In addition to assessing the breeding success of shearwaters annually, the vegetation is also mapped for each site. A grid of 1 x 1 foot cells (set up in 1967 before metrication) is laid over each study site. For NISA and ThiSA the area is divided into  $60 \times 54$  cells, and for SISA  $72 \times 66$  cells. The occurrence of each plant species within a study site is calculated as the proportion of cells in which that species occurs.

The bird records for the island have been reviewed by Fullagar (1989) but many subsequent records have been included in annual reports (similar to this one) dating back to 1998. Names and taxonomic order of birds follow Christidis and Boles (2008); all other vertebrates follow Clayton *et al.* (2006). Names of butterflies follow Braby (2004) and moths follow Common (1990) while those of vascular plants follow those used by Heyligers and Adams (1989, 2004).

## **Survey Team**

This year's team comprised Peter Fullagar, Mike Crowley, Chris Davey and David Priddel (MIPartners); Lesley Priddel, Penny Beaver, Adam Smith, Byron Smith and Brendan Smith.

#### **Weather and Habitat Conditions**

We departed Narooma at 10:30 on 24 March, crossing the bar in difficult conditions into a heavy 3m swell. It was a fairly rough passage to the island in squally seas. Intermittent rain continued until early afternoon. The following day was fine but overcast with a light NW wind. On 26 March it was warm and clear with light variable winds all day. A NE wind blew all day on 27 March in clear conditions until evening when it strengthened and switched to the SW with light rain after dark. On 28 March it was warm and sunny with a light southerly wind most of the day. We returned to Narooma on 29 March departing at 10:00 on a smooth sea with light winds in clear sunny conditions. On leaving the wharf at Montagu we made a short diversion to count seals and birds along the W and N sides of north island.

Monthly rainfall figures (mm) for the period March 2016 to March 2017 are as follows: 64.8, 77.0, 13.8, 164.8, 109.4, 9.4, 94.2, 32.8, 47.8, 49.4, 13.7, 51.6 and 42.6 (to the end of the month).

Conditions this summer have been very dry, but good rain in late February and March revived the stressed vegetation. On all study sites the Spiny-headed Mat-rush *Lomandra longifolia* was lush and dense. Scarlet Runner *Kennedia rubicunda* is now well established on NISA and SISA.

Kikuyu Grass continues to spread alarmingly throughout the island. The spread of Coastal Morning Glory *Ipomoea cairica c*ontinues and is now another invasive species of concern (Crowley *et al.* 2016).

## Coverage

We started work on ThiSA at 15:45 on 24 March, stopping at 18:45. On 25 March we completed ThiSA between 08:45 and 10:10. We then started SISA at 10:30 and worked until lunch (13:00-14:40). Work on SISA was completed at 19:15. We started work on NISA at 09:00 on 27 March and finished at 16:30. On 26 March we made casual observations on north and south island. We completed nine penguin landing site counts at dusk on 26 March.

## **Survey Results**

#### 1. Shearwaters

The results of this year's survey, together with those for 2016, are summarised in Table 1.

As Table 1 shows, the number of burrows found this year was slightly more than found in 2016 and the overall percentage of occupied burrows was considerably higher (56%).


The average weight of Wedge-tailed Shearwater chicks this season was 417g (233-651g); the comparable figure for Short-tailed Shearwater was 627g (247–970g). All chicks were in good condition.

The average weights of Wedge-tailed Shearwater chicks in 2016 was 495g and of Short-tailed Shearwater 629g. These average weights are not comparable with those of 2017 because 2016 measurements were taken a week earlier. In 2015, when measurements were taken at the same time of year as in 2017, average weights were considerably heavier: 537g for Wedge-tailed Shearwater chicks and 724g for Short-tailed Shearwater chicks.

This was a record year for Wedge-tailed Shearwater, with the total number of chicks (135) being the highest ever recorded over the past 58 years. As a proportion of chicks on each study plot Wedge-tailed Shearwaters comprised 83% on NISA, 37% on ThiSA and 51% on SISA. To illustrate the steady increase of this species on our study areas

over time we have plotted the combined totals from two of the study plots that have been searched each year from 1967 to the present (see Fig. 1).




Overall Short-tailed Shearwaters numbers increased over those found last year except on NISA which is a study area now heavily dominated by Wedge-tailed Shearwaters. One Sooty Shearwater chick was found on ThiSA.

This year the number of chicks on our study areas was the highest ever on ThiSA (26 years), the 6th highest on SISA (58 years and last exceeded in 1981) and the 15th highest on NISA (51 years). Expansion of the breeding colony of Wedge-tailed Shearwaters on Montagu Island, in particular over the last 20 years, is matched by recent extensions in the range of this species elsewhere. For example, a first recorded breeding on Gabo Island, Victoria was reported this season by Brownlie & Arnold (2016), as was breeding for the first time on Motu

Nui, Easter Island, Chile (see HBW Alive, 2017). World breeding distribution of this shearwater is shown in Fig. 2 with the locations of these two recent extensions indicated.

## 2. Penguins

Nine landing sites, of which 8 were prime, on the south island were surveyed on 26 March; seven on the W side and two on the E side of the island. Prime sites are those where the greatest numbers of penguins would land in the past. No penguins were seen arriving at any site between 18:30 and 20:00. Very few birds were noted ashore at any time during the survey this March. As noted last year, no penguin was found on any of the shearwater study sites.

There has been a significant decline in the number of penguins breeding on the island over the last decade, the cause of which is not clearly understood. One possibility is predation by the New Zealand Fur Seal *Arctocephalus forsteri*, a species that has increased in number on the island during that time. When doing observations at penguin landing sites we regularly note patrolling seals at dusk close inshore.

## 3. Vegetation

Five perennial plant species occur regularly on the study sites: Spinyheaded Mat-rush, Bracken *Pteridium esculentum*, Scarlet Runner, Kikuyu Grass and Tussock Grass *Poa poiformes*. Although Mat-rush continues to heavily dominate each of the three study sites there has been a gradual change in occurrence of the other four species within two of the study sites. A comparison of species composition in 2017 with that of 10 years ago is shown in Table 2.

Bracken *Pteridium esculentum* has been recorded only on SISA, with very little change occurring over the 10 year period. Scarlet Runner has increased considerably over both NISA and SISA. For SISA this vine now occupies 50% of cells. Kikuyu Grass has been recorded on SISA only where, despite periodic chemical control, it has increased to now occupy over 10% of cells. Tussock Grass *Poa poiformes* has been recorded only on NISA where its distribution has decreased. At present levels, none of these perennials appears to affect overall shearwater breeding success.

## General Observations of Birds, Mammals, Reptiles and Lepidoptera BIRDS

Thirty-two species were recorded this year and eight eBird lists were submitted. See http://ebird.org/content/ebird/about/.

**Brown Quail** *Coturnix ypsilophora*. Numerous on all parts of the island. Coveys seen in several places and we observed at least 44 individuals, although many more were likely to have been present.

**Bar-shouldered Dove** *Geopelia humeralis*. Two seen on 25 March in thickets (Accidental zone).

White-faced Storm-Petrel *Pelagodroma marina*. A single nest survey in December 2016 found only 50% of study burrows from the 2015-16 season were occupied in 2016-17. The loss of active burrows to Wedgetailed Shearwaters is thought to be approximately 20-25% per annum (N. Carlile pers. comm.). Nineteen geolocator units were attached in summer 2016 but none have yet been recovered. The artificial nesting and sound attraction site established on the eastern side of the north island successfully operated throughout the recent breeding season but, as far as is known, has yet to encourage visitation by this species (N. Carlile pers. comm.).

**Wedge-tailed Shearwater** *Ardenna pacifica,* **Sooty Shearwater**, *A. grisea* and **Short-tailed Shearwater** *A. tenuirostris*. See Table 1 for this year's chick count. Few shearwaters seen at sea during the visit but a raft of c 250 E of island early in the afternoon on 28 March was seen feeding and resting.

**Fluttering Shearwater** *Puffinus gavia*. One seen during crossing to the island on 24 March.

**Gould's Petrel** *Pterodroma leucoptera*. No surveys were carried out on this species during the 2016-17 breeding season, but incidental observations during chick rearing suggested a good level of breeding success, in stark contrast to the previous season.

**Little Penguin** *Eudyptula minor*. Few seen (see text above under survey results).

**Australasian Gannet** *Morus serrator*. A few observed at sea most days with up to c 20 on 28 March with feeding shearwaters, all of which appeared to be immature.

**White-faced Heron** *Egretta novaehollandiae*. Maximum of four seen (from the boat) near the seals on the north side of north island on 29 March.

**Cattle Egret** *Bubulcus coromandus*. One seen flying over N end of south island on 26 March and two on rocks S side of Pebbly Beach (the large bay midway along the west side of north island) on 29 March, near seals.

White-bellied Sea-Eagle *Haliaeetus leucogaster*. Seen occasionally with maximum of three adults on one day.

**Swamp Harrier** *Circus approximans*. One male seen occasionally.

**Nankeen Kestrel** *Falco cenchroides*. None seen this year. During a visit in October 2016 by CCD and PJF, only one female seen. No breeding recorded. First time in 58 years that no Kestrel present at this time of year on the island.

**Peregrine Falcon** *Falco peregrinus*. A pair seen some days. No signs of breeding activity at known nest sites.

**Buff-banded Rail** *Gallirallus philippensis*. Few birds seen on south island. None observed on north island.

**Sooty Oystercatcher** *Haematopus fuliginosus*. Six birds seen on the island.

**Brown Noddy** *Anous stolidus*. One seen at South Landing at midday and dusk on 26 March. Photos attached on eBird list from this day.

**Caspian Tern** *Hydroprogne caspia*. Seen most days with a maximum of 9 on 26 March.

Crested Tern Thalasseus bergii. Few seen.

**Silver Gull** *Chroicocephalus novaehollandiae*. A few seen daily with one late fledged chick still present near light station.

**Jaeger** sp. One probable **Arctic Jaeger** *Stercorarius parasiticus* seen passing S on 24 March during crossing to the island.

**Brush Cuckoo** *Cacomantis variolosus*. One seen late afternoon 28 March (zone 5). First record for the island.

**Eastern Spinebill** *Acanthorhynchus tenuirostris* one seen in thickets on W side of island on 26 March (Accidental zone). First record for the island.

**Yellow-faced Honeyeater** *Lichenostomus chrysops*. Commonly seen in thickets along W side of south island. Numbers too numerous to assess. One juvenile bird seen on 25 March.

**Black-faced Cuckoo-shrike** *Coracina novaehollandiae*. One seen in thickets W side of south island on 26 March (Accidental zone).

**Golden Whistler** *Pachycephala pectoralis*. One female heard and seen on W side of south island on 26 March (zone 5)

**Grey Fantail** *Rhipidura albiscapa*. One seen on 26 March in thickets on south island (Accidental zone).

**Australian Raven** *Corvus coronoides*. Two calling and seen on 28 March near light station.

**Golden-headed Cisticola** *Cisticola exilis*. Not vocal and difficult to detect with few seen.

**Little Grassbird** *Megalurus gramineus*. Inconspicuous at this time of year; few seen.

**Silvereye** *Zosterops lateralis*. Present on most days but numbers too numerous to assess.

**Welcome Swallow** *Hirundo neoxena*. Seen daily. Minimum numbers estimated at 18.

#### MAMMALS

Seals. A count on 26 March gave 34 on the SW side of south island at South Landing (zone 2). On north island a total of 64 was counted, of which the majority were at the NW corner. Most of the north island animals were thought to be Australian Fur Seal Arctocephalus pusillus. However, eight pups seen on north island were close together in a location normally occupied by New Zealand Fur Seal. The seals on south island were probably also New Zealand Fur Seal. A repeat count on north island on 29 March (from the boat on our return to Narooma) gave a total of 78 seals and included at least a dozen pups. All but 20 or so of these animals were thought to be New Zealand Fur Seal.

#### REPTILES

White's Skink *Ergenia whitii*. Observed occasionally. Grass Sun-skink *Lampropholis guichenoti*. Observed occasionally.

#### **LEPIDOPTERA**

Very few seen

**Common Brown** *Heteronympha merope.* A few seen in the gulch between north and south island and along the W side of south island. **Long-tailed Pea-blue** *Lampides boeticus.* A few seen on Coast Rosemary *Westringia fruticosa* in the gulch on 26 March.
