

#### INTRODUCTION

*Nature in Eurobodalla 37* provides a summary of the status of the fauna of the Eurobodalla Shire compiled from records submitted to the Eurobodalla Natural History Society during 2022. The report is restricted to those species recorded during the year; species not recorded are not listed. An annotated list of all bird species recorded in the Eurobodalla since the inception of the Society in 1986 is available on the Society's website (www.enhs.org.au) and is updated annually to reflect new sightings. A map of the Shire is also available on the Society's website.

2022 was exceptionally wet, with cooler days (maximum temperatures lower than average) and warmer nights (minimum temperatures higher than average). It was the third wet year in a row and the wettest of the three. Three of the Bureau of Meteorology stations in the Shire (Araluen, Moruya Airport and Kiora) recorded their highest ever annual rainfall, whilst most others recorded their highest falls for more than 20 years. Moruya Heads recorded 1396mm and Narooma 1372mm, respectively 45% and 48% higher than average. March was the wettest month, with members recording 388mm at Bergalia, 349mm at Maulbrooks Rd and 343mm at Coolagolite, though there were also heavy falls in October. June was a dry exception, the 8th driest on record statewide, only 3mm were recorded at Maulbrooks Rd, 8.5mm at Comerang and 10mm at Bergalia.

Moruya Airport had two interesting temperature records during the year. Its coldest day on record (lowest maximum temperature) came on 23 August, with a maximum of 11 degrees, after the passage of a strong cold front. In contrast it also its highest annual mean daily minimum temperature on record.

Due to the wet weather, there were fewer field meetings held in 2022 than would normally be the case. No off-shore field trips were undertaken during the year and the few records of pelagic species are from land-based observations. Members of the Society did once again participate in the NSW Parks and Wildlife shorebird monitoring programs and in BirdLife Australia surveys.

The year provided one new bird species for the Shire, a single, much photographed, Radjah Shelduck (*Radjah radjah*) spent some weeks at the Batemans Bay Water Gardens. Two seldom reported species were also recorded, a Buller's Albatross (*Thalassarche bulleri*) off South Head, Moruya and a Brown Noddy (*Anous stolidus*) at Mystery Bay. In addition, Blue-billed Duck (*Oxyura australis*) bred at Bevian Swamp, the first time this has been recorded in the Shire.

Missing from the records in 2022 were several species commonly recorded, including Hardhead, Nankeen Night Heron, White-fronted Tern and Little Eagle. For the second consecutive year there were no reports of White-fronted Chat and for the third year there were no reports of crakes and rails other than the Buff-banded Rail.

A Platypus (*Ornithorhynchus anatinus*) was sighted in the Tuross River at Comerang, near Bodalla. This is the first record in the Eurobodalla since 2019. Thirty Common Dolphin (*Delphinus delphus*) were reported off Burrewarra Point and were also recorded at Surf Beach. This species occurs in our area but is not often reported and may be overlooked. A species which may be overlooked because of its nocturnal behaviour is the Feathertail Glider (*Acrobates pygmaeus*) and this year it was reported at Lilli Pilli and Corunna. The rarely reported Barred-sided Skink (Concinnia tenuis) was seen at two locations, Mossy Point and Pedro Swamp. We had our first record of the tiny Gem Moth (*Glyphipterix chrysoplanetis*) and it was also the first time that a moth in the family Glyphipterigidae had been recorded. Two species of introduced deer spread their range this year with records of Sambar Dear (*Cervus unicolor*) at Pedro Swamp and Coolagolite and Fallow Dear (*Dama dama*) at Coolagolite as well as at a previous location, West Flat, Bodalla.

The taxonomic sequence in which the bird species are listed follows the Birdlife Australia Working List of Australian Birds v4 published in December 2022. The taxonomic sequence used for other vertebrate species basically follows Clayton *et al* (2006). Taxonomic references used in compiling

this report are listed below. The conservation status ascribed to bird species (Critically Endangered, Endangered and Vulnerable) is that given in Schedule 1 of the NSW Biodiversity Conservation Act, 2016.

Once again, my thanks go to all contributors who have made this report possible. I particularly thank my co-complier, Julie Morgan, for her work as the Society's Recorder during the year. A complete list of those who have contributed observations during the year appears on the final page.

Two reported at Potato Point on 27 May. (MA)

#### **PHASIANIDAE** Quail, pheasants.

Status: uncommon breeding resident.

Up to 10 at Comerang in Jan-Jun and Nov-Dec, 4-6 in other months. (JC)

# **Brown Quail** Synoicus ypsilophorus

Status: uncommon breeding resident.

Four at Comerang in Mar and Dec, 2 in Jan-Feb and Apr; 1 at Bengello Beach in Oct and at

Coolagolite in Nov-Dec. (JC/DGK/DO)

### **ANATIDAE** Swans, geese, ducks.

### Blue-billed Duck Oxyura australis

Status: Vulnerable; vagrant.

Eleven at Barlings Swamp in Jan, 10 in Jul, 9 in May, 4 in Feb.

Breeding: 3 young in Jan. (NC/JM)

### Musk Duck Biziura lobata

Status: uncommon breeding resident.

Three at Pedro Swamp in Jan and at Long Swamp in Feb; 1 at Narooma in Apr and Jun and at Brou L

in Dec.

### Pink-eared Duck Malacorhynchus membranaceus

Status: vagrant.

Two at Moruya on 13 May. (JC)

# Black Swan Cygnus atratus

Status: common breeding resident and bird of passage.

Widely reported throughout the year; up to 80 at Wallaga Lake in Jan and South Head, Moruya in Apr; 52 at Moruya in Sep; 50 at Coila Lake in Nov; 20 at Mystery Bay in Feb-Mar, May, Aug and

Dec; no more than 15 at other locations.

Breeding: cygnets in Jul-Oct.

## Radjah Shelduck Radjah radjah

Status: vagrant.

One photographed at Batemans Bay Water Garden from late May to mid June, first record for the

Shire.

### Australian Shelduck Tadorna tadornoides

Status: vagrant.

Up to 8 at Comerang in May, 3 in Apr, 2 in Mar, Jun-Jul and Sep-Oct.

## Australian Wood Duck Chenonetta jubata

Status: common breeding resident.

Widely reported throughout the year; up to 60 at Comerang in Jul-Aug; 47 at South Durras in May; 35 at Tilba in Feb; 34 at Bergalia in Dec; no more than 20 at other locations.

Breeding: dependent young in Jan-Feb, Aug-Oct and Dec.

### Australasian Shoveler Spatula rhynchotis

Status: uncommon winter migrant, has bred.

Two at Moruya on 16 May. (JC)

#### Pacific Black Duck Anas superciliosa

Status: common breeding resident.

Widely reported throughout the year; up to 300 at Comerang in Apr-Jun; 30 at Moruya in Sep; 4 at Mystery Bay in Aug and at Belowra in Dec; 3 at Meringo in Aug; no more than 2 at other locations. Breeding: dependent young at Comerang in Oct. (JC)

### **Grey Teal** Anas gracilis

Status: breeding resident.

Reported throughout the year; up to 20 at Comerang in Mar-Jun and Dec, 10 in other months; 20 in Moruya in Sep.

Breeding: dependent young at Comerang in Dec. (JC)

#### Chestnut Teal Anas castanea

Status: common breeding resident.

Reported throughout the year; up to 100 at Comerang in Apr and Jun-Jul, 20-80 in other months; 50 at Moruya in Sep, 25 in May; 10 at Meringo in Aug and at South Durras in Oct; fewer than 10 at other locations.

Breeding: nesting at Comerang in November, dependent young in Feb. (JC)

#### PODICIPEDIDAE Grebes.

### Australasian Grebe Tachybaptus novaehollandiae

Status: common breeding resident.

Up to 20 at Comerang in May-Jul; 5 at Mystery Bay in Apr; single birds at Barlings Swamp in Jul and South Durras in Oct.

### Hoary-headed Grebe Poliocephalus poliocephalus

Status: breeding resident.

Three at Long Swamp in Feb; 2 at Mystery Bay in Apr; 1 at Meringo in Aug.

#### **COLUMBIDAE** Pigeons, doves.

#### Rock Dove Columba livia

Status: common breeding resident.

Established colonies at Batemans Bay, Moruya and Narooma; up to 50 at Narooma in Aug, 30-35 most other months; 20 at Moruya in Jul; 4 at Comerang in Oct and Dec.

#### White-headed Pigeon Columba leucomela

Status: common breeding resident.

Recorded in all months; up to 30 at Trunketabella in Apr; 17 at Tuross in Dec; 10 at South Durras in Sep; 7 at Maulbrooks Rd in Sep-Oct; no more than 4 at other locations.

### **Spotted Dove** *Spilopelia chinensis*

Status: breeding resident.

Recorded in all months; 4 at Mystery Bay in Aug; no more than 2 at six other locations.

### Brown Cuckoo-Dove Macropygia phasianella

Status: uncommon breeding resident and bird of passage.

Recorded in all months; up to 20 at Maulbrooks Rd in Jul, 2-15 in other months; 4 at Mogendoura in Aug; no more than 2 at other locations.

#### Wonga Pigeon Leucosarcia melaoleuca

Status: common breeding resident.

Up to 6 at Mystery Bay in Jul; 4 in most other months; 3 at Coolagolite in Jan and at Narooma in Nov; 1, 2 or calls at 7 other locations.

### Common Bronzewing Phaps chalcoptera

Status: common breeding resident.

Widely recorded in all months; up to 20 at Maulbrooks Rd in Mar, 18 in Jul; 13 at Comerang in May; 7 at Coolagolite in Jan; 6 at Broulee in Nov; no more than 4 at other locations.

### Crested Pigeon Ocyphaps lophotes

Status: common breeding resident.

Recorded in all months; up to 8 at Mystery Bay in Mar; 7 at Comerang in Apr and Jul; 6 at South Durras in Feb; 3 at Bergalia in Aug-Sep; no more than 2 at other locations.

### Peaceful Dove Geopelia striata

Status: breeding resident but becoming less common.

One at Surf Beach in Jan and at Broulee in Apr. (NC/GLM)

### **Bar-shouldered Dove** *Geopelia humeralis*

Status: uncommon resident.

Three at Bingie in Feb; 1 at Comerang in Mar-Apr and at Cullendulla Creek in Jul; calls at Narooma in Jan.

#### **Topknot Pigeon** *Lopholaimus antarcticus*

Status: bird of passage.

Recorded Jan-Feb and Sep-Dec; up to 150 at Meringo in Dec; 100 at Cullendulla Creek in Dec; 30 at Pedro Swamp in Jan, 20 in Dec; 12 at Coila Lake in Nov; 5 at Bingie in Jan; 2 at Comerang in Nov.

### **PODARGIDAE** Frogmouths.

# Tawny Frogmouth Podargus strigoides

Status: breeding resident.

Up to 4 at Pedro in Nov, 2 in Aug; 2 at Coolagolite in Jun-Jul; 1 at Mystery Bay in May, Jul and Oct and at Meringo in Dec.

### **EUROSTOPODIDAE** Eared Nightjars.

### White-throated Nightjar Eurostopodus mystacalis

Status: summer breeding migrant.

Up to 4 at Pedro Swamp in Feb and Nov, 3 in Jan and 2 in Dec; calls at Maulbrooks Rd in Feb. (JM/SMG)

## **AEGOTHELIDAE** Owlet-nightjars.

# Australian Owlet-nightjar Aegotheles cristatus

Status: breeding resident.

One at Comerang in Mar and May; calls at Pedro Swamp in Mar-Apr and Oct-Nov, at Murramarrang National Park in Mar and at Gulaga in Sep.

#### **APODIDAE** Swifts.

### White-throated Needletail Hirundapus caudacutus

Status: summer migrant.

Reported Jan-Apr and Dec; up to 3000 at Surfside in Feb, 60 in Jan and 50 in Apr; 25 at Pedro Swamp in Feb, 20 in Jan and Mar; fewer than 6 at other locations.

# Fork-tailed Swift Apus pacificus

Status: rare summer migrant.

Two reported at Surfside on 6 Jan. (DB)

### **CUCULACIDAE** Cuckoos.

### Eastern Koel Eudynamys orientalis

Status: summer breeding migrant.

Reported Jan-Mar and Sep-Dec; up to 8 at Broulee in Nov, 4 in Jan; 1-2 or calls at 13 other locations. Breeding: young at Broulee in Jan being fed by Red Wattlebird. (GH)

### Channel-billed Cuckoo Scythrops novaehollandiae

Status: summer breeding migrant.

Reported Jan-Feb and Sep-Dec; 5 at Pedro Swamp in Nov; 4 at Coolagolite in Dec; 1-2 or calls at 8 other locations.

Breeding: young in Jan at Pedro Swamp being fed by Pied Currawong and at Coolagolite in Dec. (JM/DO)

#### Horsfield's Bronze-Cuckoo Chalcites basalis

Status: summer breeding migrant.

One at Comerang in Sep; calls at Pedro Swamp in Aug-Oct. (JC/JM)

### Shining Bronze-Cuckoo Chalcites lucidus

Status: summer breeding migrant and bird of passage. Two at Gulaga in Sep; 1 or calls at 9 other locations.

### Fan-tailed Cuckoo Cacomantis flabelliformis

Status: common breeding resident.

Recorded in all months except Jul; 6 at Broulee in Sep; 4 at Pedro Swamp in Aug-Sep; 3 at Meringo in Sep; 2 at Bergalia in Sep; 1 or calls at 12 other locations.

#### **Brush Cuckoo** Cacomantis variolosus

Status: summer breeding migrant.

Recorded in Jan and Sep-Dec; 2 at Pedro Swamp in Oct, calls in other months; 1 at Comerang in Oct, calls in Nov-Dec; calls at Maulbrooks Rd in Jan and Oct-Dec and at Mystery Bay in Nov. (JC/JM/SMG/MA)

### Pallid Cuckoo Heteroscenes pallidus

Status: summer breeding migrant.

Two at Belowra in Dec; 1 at Comerang in Nov, calls in Oct and Dec. (FM/JC)

### **RALLIDAE** Rails, crakes, swamphens.

### **Buff-banded Rail** Hypotaenidia philippensis

Status: rare breeding resident.

One at Coila Lake and at Coolagolite in Jun. (DHK/DO)

### Purple Swamphen Porphyrio porphyrio

Status: common breeding resident.

Recorded throughout the year; up to 18 at Mystery Bay in Aug, 10 in Apr; 12 at Bergalia in Mar; 10 at Meringo in Aug; 8 at the Eurobodalla Regional Botanic Gardens in May; no more than 6 at other locations.

Breeding: dependent young in Jan-Apr and Sep-Dec.

### Dusky Moorhen Gallinula tenebrosa

Status: uncommon breeding resident. Six at Meringo in Oct, 1 in Aug.

Breeding: dependent young at Meringo in Oct. (NM)

#### **Eurasian Coot** Fulica atra

Status: common breeding resident. Six at Mystery Bay in Apr. (MA)

# **SPHENISCIDAE** Penguins

### **Little Penguin** *Eudyptula minor*

Common breeding resident.

One dead at Mystery Bay in Oct. (MA)

### **DIOMEDEIDAE** Albatrosses

### Black-browed Albatross Thalassarche melanophris

Status: Vulnerable; common winter pelagic.

Three off South Head, Moruya in Apr, 1 in Jul; 1 off Burrewarra Pt in Jul. (DB/GC)

# Shy Albatross Thalassarche cauta

Status: Endangered; common winter pelagic.

Four off South Head, Moruya in Apr, 2 in Jul. (DB/GC)

#### **Buller's Albatross** Thalassarche bulleri

Status: occasionally recorded off the coast.

One off South Head, Moruya on 2 Jul. (GC)

#### **PROCELLARIIDAE** Petrels, shearwaters.

### **Giant Petrel sp**

One off South Head, Moruya on 2 Jul. (GC)

#### Shearwater sp.

Thousands migrating south off Kianga on 5 Oct; 10 off Wallaga Lake in Feb; 1 at Tuross in May.

### Wedge-tailed Shearwater Ardenna pacifica

Status: common breeding resident and summer migrant.

Twelve off South Head, Moruya in Feb, 2 in Apr; 2 off Burrewarra Point in Jul. (NC/DB/GC)

### **Short-tailed Shearwater** *Ardenna tenuirostris*

Status: common summer breeding migrant.

One off South Head, Moruya on 3 Apr. (DB)

### Fluttering Shearwater Puffinus gavia

Status: common pelagic.

Up to 150 off Burrewarra Pt on 21 Aug, 100 on 4 Jul. (GC)

### THRESKIORNITHIDAE Ibis, spoonbills.

#### Royal Spoonbill Platalea regia

Status: common resident.

Up to 50 at Comerang in May; 40 at Bumbo Rd in Dec; 18 at Narooma in Jul; 12 at Mystery Bay in

May; 6 at Wallaga Lake in Jul and at Broulee in Sep; no more than 5 at other locations.

### Australian White Ibis Threskiornis moluccus

Status: common resident and winter-spring migrant.

Up to 30 at Moruya in May; 15 at Narooma in Apr; 8 at Broulee in Sep; 6 at Mystery Bay in Jun-Jul; no more than 3 at other locations.

### Straw-necked Ibis Threskiornis spinicollis

Status: winter-spring migrant and bird of passage.

Up to 60 at Comerang in Mar; 40 at Mogendoura in Aug; 35 at Bergalia in Jul; 5 at Meringo in Jul; 3 at Moruya in Sep; 2 at Broulee in Jul.

### **ARDEIDAE** Bitterns, herons, egrets.

#### **Striated Heron** *Butorides striata*

Status: uncommon breeding resident.

Single birds at Narooma in Feb and Jul, at Cullendulla Creek in Apr, at Congo and Coila Lake in Jun and at Broulee in Jul and Sep.

### Cattle Egret Bubulcus ibis

Status: common autumn-spring migrant.

Recorded Apr-Nov; up to 200 at Comerang in Apr, 10-30 in May-Aug; 50 at Moruya in May, 5-30 in other months; 1 at Bumbo Rd in Jun.

#### White-necked Heron Ardea pacifica

Status: breeding resident.

Two at Broulee in Nov; single birds at 4 other locations during the year.

### **Great Egret** Ardea alba

Status: common resident.

Up to 70 at Moruya in Jul; 8 at Bumbo Rd in Dec; 6 at Broulee in Jun; 5 at Narooma in Aug; 4 at Mystery Bay in June; 3 at Comerang in May and Oct; no more than 2 at other locations.

### **Intermediate Egret** Ardea intermedia

Status: uncommon migrant.

Two at Narooma in Oct, 1 in Apr and Jul; 1 at Comerang in Apr-May and at Moruya in Sep. (JC/MA)

### White-faced Heron Egretta novaehollandiae

Status: common breeding resident.

Reported in all months; 30 at Comerang in Jul, 20 in Jun and Aug; 17 at Narooma in Jan, 16 in Mar; 12 at Mystery Bay in Apr; no more than 4 at other locations.

### Little Egret Egretta garzetta

Status: common resident.

Up to 12 at Narooma in Oct-Nov; 8 at Nangudga in Feb, at Mystery Bay in Mar and at Moruya in Jul; 4 at Broulee in Jun; single birds at 4 other locations.

### Eastern Reef Egret Egretta sacra

Status: resident.

Four at Narooma in Feb, 2 in May-Jul; 2 at Broulee in Feb and Jul-Aug and at Meringo in Oct; single birds at 4 other locations during the year.

#### **PELICANIDAE** Pelican.

# Australian Pelican Pelecanus conspicillatus

Status: common resident.

Reported in all months but in smaller numbers than previous years; 12 at Mystery Bay in Apr, 10 in May and Nov; 11 at Meringo in Jul; 6 at Broulee in Apr; no more than 5 at other locations.

### **SULIDAE** Gannets, boobies.

#### **Australasian Gannet** *Morus serrator*

Status: common winter migrant and bird of passage.

Up to 30 off Meringo in Jul; 12 off Burrewarra Pt in Jun; 10 off Wasp Head in Jun; 8 off Broulee in Jun-Jul; 3 off South Head, Moruya in May; 2 off Mystery Bay in Mar-Apr and South Durras in May.

# PHALACROCORACIDAE Cormorants.

#### **Little Pied Cormorant** *Microcarbo melanoleucos*

Status: common breeding resident.

Reported in all months; 20 at Broulee in Jun; 15 at Narooma in Nov; 10 at Mystery Bay in May and at Congo in Dec; 6 at Comerang in May-Jun and at Broulee in Jul-Aug; no more than 5 at other locations.

### **Great Cormorant** *Phalacrocorax carbo*

Status: common resident.

Reported in all months; 25 at Narooma in Nov; 15 at Mystery Bay in Jan-Feb; 10 at South Durras in Oct and at Congo in Dec; 9 at Broulee in Sep; 8 at Meringo in Oct; no more than 4 at other locations.

#### **Little Black Cormorant** *Phalacrocorax sulcirostris*

Status: common resident.

Reported in all months; 15 at Bodalla in Aug; 12 at Broulee in Jul; 8 at South Durras and Narooma in Nov; 6 at Mystery Bay in May-Jun; no more than 5 at other locations.

### **Great Pied Cormorant** Phalacrocorax varius

Status: uncommon resident.

Six at Narooma in May and Nov; 3 at Broulee in Jun and Sep; 2 at Congo in Dec; 1 at Mystery Bay in Jan and at South Durras in Nov-Dec.

#### ANHINGIDAE Darter.

#### Australasian Darter Anhinga novaehollandiae

Status: breeding resident.

One overflying Mungerarie Fire Trail in Apr; 1 at Comerang Jun-Aug. (JM/JC)

### **HAEMATOPODIDAE** Oystercatchers.
