INTRODUCTION

Nature in Eurobodalla 38 provides a summary of the status of the fauna of the Eurobodalla Shire compiled from records submitted to the Eurobodalla Natural History Society during 2023. The report is restricted to those species recorded during the year; species not recorded are not listed. An annotated list of all bird species recorded in the Eurobodalla since the inception of the Society in 1986 is available on the Society's website (www.enhs.org.au) and is updated annually to reflect new sightings. A map of the Shire is also available on the Society's website.

2023 was a warm year with the statewide annual mean temperature 1.30°C above the 1961–1990 average, which is the equal sixth-highest on record. In the Eurobodalla, new records were set, or existing records equaled, at Bureau of Meteorology stations for the highest annual mean temperature (Montague Island) and highest annual mean daily maximum temperature (Montagu Island and Narooma). Montague Island and Moruya Airport also had their warmest night (highest daily minimum temperature) on record on 29 January.

Rainfall for the year was lower than average for the Bureau of Meteorology stations along the coast, with 770mm at Moruya Heads (81%) and 861mm at Narooma (93%). In contrast the station at Kiora had 1973mm, its highest total annual rainfall in 29 years of records. As much as 50% of the rain fell in the last 6 weeks of the year, with the highest ever daily rainfalls recorded at two Moruya stations, Burra Creek (225mm) and Kiora (293mm) on 29 and 30 November respectively. November and December were the wettest months, with members recording 285mm at Maulbrooks Rd and 257 at Bergalia in November and 315 at Comerang and 233 at Mystery Bay in December. July was the driest month, with no more than 1mm recorded.

The year provided just one new bird species for the Shire, a pair of Red-whiskered Bulbul (*Pycnonotus jocosus*), presumed to be aviary escapes or releases, reported in Dalmeny and Narooma in November. Two new reptile species were also added to the Society's records; a Common Scalyfoot (*Pygopus lepidopodus*) found at Coila Lake in September and a Burton's Legless Lizard (*Lialis burtonis*) found deceased at Pedro Swamp in November

The seldom recorded Beach Stone-curlew (*Esacus magnirostris*) was reported at Lilli Pilli in August and at South Durras and Brou Lake in October after a 10-year absence from the records. Also returning to the records after a 3-year absence were three species of crake (Ballion's, Spotless and Spotted) all of which were seen at the Batemans Bay Water Gardens in October to December. White-fronted Chat also returned to Coila Lake after a 2-year absence from the records. Missing from the records in 2023 were two species usually recorded, the Swift Parrot and Fairy Martin.

The taxonomic sequence in which the bird species are listed follows the Birdlife Australia Working List of Australian Birds v4 published in December 2022. The taxonomic sequence used for other vertebrate species basically follows Clayton *et al* (2006). Taxonomic references used in compiling this report are listed below. The conservation status ascribed to bird species (Critically Endangered, Endangered and Vulnerable) is that given in Schedule 1 of the NSW Biodiversity Conservation Act, 2016.

Once again, my thanks go to all contributors who have made this report possible. I particularly thank my co-complier, Julie Morgan, for her work as the Society's Recorder during the year. A complete list of those who have contributed observations during the year appears on the final page.

BIRDS

CASUARIIDAE Emu.

Emu Dromaius novaehollandiae

Status: introduced in 1993, small wild population established.

Two reported at Brou Lake on 24 Jan and at Potato Point on 15 Apr. (MA/FM)

PHASIANIDAE Quail, pheasants.

Stubble Quail Coturnix pectoralis

Status: uncommon breeding resident.

Up to 20 at Comerang in Feb, 6-10 in other months. (JC)

Brown Quail Synoicus ypsilophorus

Status: uncommon breeding resident.

Fifteen at Belimbla in Mar; 6 at Comerang in May-Jun, 2-4 most other months; 4 at Coolagolite in Feb, 1 in Jan and Nov; 4 at Nerrigundah in Aug. (JC/DO/GC)

ANATIDAE Swans, geese, ducks.

Musk Duck Biziura lobata

Status: uncommon breeding resident.

Four at Brou Lake in Nov; 3 at Pedro Swamp in Nov, 2 in Dec; 2 at Kianga in Dec. (JM/MA/H Watson)

Black Swan Cygnus atratus

Status: common breeding resident and bird of passage.

Widely reported throughout the year; up to 120 at Narooma in Jul; 50 at Corunna Lake in Feb, at Jemisons Point in Apr and at Coila Lake in Oct-Nov; 49 at Mystery Bay in Mar; 31 at Mummaga Lake in Aug; 20 at South Head, Moruya in Apr and at Bergalia in May; no more than 15 at other locations.

Australian Shelduck Tadorna tadornoides

Status: vagrant.

Two at Comerang in Jul and Sep. (JC)

Australian Wood Duck Chenonetta jubata

Status: common breeding resident.

Widely reported throughout the year; up to 600 at Bumbo Rd in Jul; 80 at Comerang in Oct; 60 at Moruya in May and at Narooma in Jul; 53 at Mystery Bay in May; 47 at South Durras in Jan; 35 at Jemisons Point in Apr; no more than 30 at other locations.

Breeding: dependent young at South Durras in Jan. (JCoF)

Hardhead Aythya australis

Status: common resident and bird of passage.

Three at Comerang in Jun; 1 at Bermagui in Mar. (JC/MA)

Australasian Shoveler Spatula rhynchotis

Status: uncommon winter migrant, has bred.

Six at Comerang in Jun. (JC)

Pacific Black Duck Anas superciliosa

Status: common breeding resident.

Widely reported throughout the year; up to 500 at Comerang in Apr-May, 400 in Jun-Jul; 80 at Bumbo Rd in Jun; 25 at Coila Lake in Nov; 24 at Barlings Swamp in Oct; 22 at Tuross River in Nov; no more than 20 at other locations.

Grey Teal Anas gracilis

Status: breeding resident.

Reported throughout the year; up to 30 at Coila Lake in Nov; 20 at Comerang in Jan, Apr-May and Dec and at Tuross River in Nov; 8 at Broulee in Jan-Feb; no more than 4 at other locations.

Chestnut Teal Anas castanea

Status: common breeding resident.

Reported throughout the year; up to 200 at Coila Lake in Oct, 100 in Nov; 100 at Bingie in Apr; 50 at Comerang in Apr-Jun, Aug. Oct and Dec; 35 at South Durras in Nov; 30 at Tuross River in Nov; no more than 20 at other locations.

Breeding: dependent young at South Durras in Jan. (JCof)

PODICIPEDIDAE Grebes.

Australasian Grebe Tachybaptus novaehollandiae

Status: common breeding resident.

Up to 40 at Comerang in May-Aug; 28 at Mummaga Lake in Aug; 20 at Tuross River in Nov; 16 at Coila Lake in Sep; 11 at Mystery Bay in Sep; fewer than 10 at other locations.

Hoary-headed Grebe Poliocephalus poliocephalus

Status: breeding resident.

Twelve at Coila Lake in Nov, 2 in Oct; 6 at Pedro Swamp in Nov; 4 at Meringo in Jul; 1 at Eurobodalla Rd in Jul.

COLUMBIDAE Pigeons, doves.

Rock Dove Columba livia

Status: common breeding resident.

Established colonies at Batemans Bay, Moruya and Narooma; up to 30 at Narooma most months; 10 at Comerang in Dec, 8 in Oct; 8 at Bumbo Rd in Jun.

White-headed Pigeon Columba leucomela

Status: common breeding resident.

Recorded in all months; up to 20 at Tuross in May, 10 in Oct; 10 at Maulbrooks Rd in Jan; 7 at South Durras in Nov; 6 at Narooma in Aug and Nov; no more than 5 at other locations.

Breeding: juvenile at Comerang in Mar. (JC)

Spotted Dove *Spilopelia chinensis*

Status: breeding resident.

Recorded in all months; 5 at Comerang in Aug-Oct, 2-4 in other months; 2 at South Durras in Jan and at Mystery Bay each month; 1 at Jemisons Point in Apr.

Brown Cuckoo-Dove Macropygia phasianella

Status: uncommon breeding resident and bird of passage.

Up to 20 at Maulbrooks Rd in Jul, 18 in Sep; 3 at Coila Creek Rd in Mar; 1-2 at 10 other locations.

Wonga Pigeon Leucosarcia melaoleuca

Status: common breeding resident.

Four at Mystery Bay most months and at Coolagolite in Jun; 2 at Pedro Swamp in Jun and at Maulbrooks Rd in Oct-Dec; 1 at Jemisons Point in Apr and at Tuross in Oct.

Common Bronzewing *Phaps chalcoptera*

Status: common breeding resident.

Widely recorded in all months; up to 24 at Maulbrooks Rd in Dec, 14 in Mar; 10 at Broulee in Jul; 7 at Comerang in Jul; no more than 4 at other locations.

Crested Pigeon Ocyphaps lophotes

Status: common breeding resident.

Recorded in all months; up to 10 at Narooma in Dec; 6 at Comerang in Jul-Sep and at Meringo in Jul; 5 at Mystery Bay in Mar; 4 at Broulee in Mar and at Eurobodalla Rd in Jul; no more than 3 at other locations.

Peaceful Dove Geopelia striata

Status: breeding resident but becoming less common.

One at Belowra on 17 Jul. (JC)

Bar-shouldered Dove *Geopelia humeralis*

Status: uncommon resident.

Three at Bingie in Jun and at Coila Lake in Nov; 1 at Mystery Bay in Jan and Aug, at Meringo in Jul and Dec, at South Durras in Sep, at Batemans Bay Water Gardens in Nov and at Kianga in Dec.

Topknot Pigeon *Lopholaimus antarcticus*

Status: bird of passage.

Recorded Jan, Apr, Jun and Sep-Dec; 25 at Pedro Swamp in Oct; 20 at Maulbrooks Rd and Surfside in Jan; 12 at Narooma in Jun; 9 at South Durras in Nov; 8 at Deua National Park in Apr; 2 at Coolagolite in Dec; 1 at Cullendulla Creek in Nov.

PODARGIDAE Frogmouths.

Tawny Frogmouth Podargus strigoides

Status: breeding resident.

Up to 4 at Mystery Bay in Nov-Dec; 3 at Broulee in Oct; 2 at Bergalia in Jan; 1 at Comerang in May and at Mossy Point in Oct.

Breeding: dependent young in Jan, juveniles in Oct and Dec. (DHK/GH/MA)

EUROSTOPODIDAE Eared Nightjars.

White-throated Nightjar Eurostopodus mystacalis

Status: summer breeding migrant.

Two at Pedro Swamp in Feb and Dec, 1 in Mar, calls in Jan and Oct; call at Surfside in Aug. (JM/DB)

AEGOTHELIDAE Owlet-nightjars.

Australian Owlet-nightjar *Aegotheles cristatus*

Status: breeding resident.

Calls at Deua National Park in Mar, at Mystery Bay in Apr and at Pedro Swamp in Aug and Dec.

APODIDAE Swifts.

White-throated Needletail Hirundapus caudacutus

Status: Vulnerable; summer migrant.

Reported Jan-Mar and Nov-Dec; up to 5000 at Surfside in Mar; 150 at South Durras in Mar; 54 at Pedro Swamp in Feb; 40 at Maulbrooks Rd in Dec; 30 at Meringo in Jan; fewer than 10 at other locations.

Fork-tailed Swift *Apus pacificus*

Status: rare summer migrant.

Twenty five at South Durras on 3 Mar. (JCof)

CUCULACIDAE Cuckoos.

Eastern Koel Eudynamys orientalis

Status: summer breeding migrant.

Reported Jan-Mar and Sep-Dec; 6 at Broulee in Nov, 5 in Dec; 4 at Bergalia and Pedro Swamp in Dec; 3 at Meringo in Jan; 1-2 or calls at 8 other locations.

Breeding: young at South Durras in Mar. (JCof)

Channel-billed Cuckoo Scythrops novaehollandiae

Status: summer breeding migrant.

Reported Jan-Feb and Sep-Dec; 3 at Pedro Swamp in Oct; 2 at Comerang in Jan, at Mystery Bay in Oct-Nov, at Bergalia and Coila Lake in Nov; 1 or calls at 5 other locations.

Horsfield's Bronze-Cuckoo Chalcites basalis

Status: summer breeding migrant.

One at Deua National Park in Apr and at Comerang in Nov. (DB/JM/JC)

Shining Bronze-Cuckoo Chalcites lucidus

Status: summer breeding migrant and bird of passage.

Single birds at Meringo in Jul, Broulee in Sep, Comerang in Sep-Dec and at Pedro Swamp in Nov-Dec.

Fan-tailed Cuckoo Cacomantis flabelliformis

Status: common breeding resident.

Recorded in all months except Jun; 4 at Pedro Swamp in Sep-Nov; 3 at Broulee in Sep; 2 at Pedro Point in Sep; 1 or calls at 9 other locations.

Brush Cuckoo Cacomantis variolosus

Status: summer breeding migrant.

Recorded in Jan and Oct-Dec; 1 at Belowra in Dec; calls at Maulbrooks Rd in Jan and at Pedro

Swamp in Jan and Oct-Dec. (JC/JM/SMG)

Pallid Cuckoo Heteroscenes pallidus

Status: summer breeding migrant.

Two at Belowra in Dec; calls at Comerang in Jan and Pedro Swamp in Nov. (JC/JM)

RALLIDAE Rails, crakes, swamphens.

Buff-banded Rail Hypotaenidia philippensis

Status: rare breeding resident.

Single birds at Comerang in Mar, at Mossy Point in Oct and Batemans Bay Water Gardens in Oct-

Nov.

Australian Spotted Crake Porzana fluminea

Status: rare resident.

Two at Batemans Bay Water Gardens on 5 Nov, 1 on 30 Oct and 1 Nov. (NC/DB)

Baillon's Crake Zapornia pusilla

Status: vagrant.

One at Batemans Bay Water Gardens in Oct-Nov. (DB/NC/J Mather)

Spotless Crake Zapornia tabuensis

Status: rare resident.

One at Batemans Bay Water Gardens in Oct-Dec. (DB/NC/MA/M Craig)

Purple Swamphen Porphyrio porphyrio

Status: common breeding resident.

Recorded throughout the year; up to 14 at Mystery Bay in Jun; 12 at Bergalia in Jan and at

Eurobodalla Regional Botanic Gardens in May; 8 at Meringo in Jul; no more than 5 at other locations.

Breeding: dependent young in Jan-Feb and Nov-Dec.

Dusky Moorhen Gallinula tenebrosa

Status: uncommon breeding resident.

Fifteen at Batemans Bay Water Gardens in Dec; 6 at Eurobodalla Regional Botanic Gardens in Oct; 3 at Comerang in Apr-May and Jul; 1 at Meringo and at Bumbo Rd in Jul.

Breeding: juveniles at Comerang in Apr. (JC)

Eurasian Coot Fulica atra

Status: common breeding resident.

Up to 500 at Jemisons Point in Apr; 100 at Comerang in Mar-Jul; 40 at Coila Lake in Nov; 30 at Bumbo Rd in Jun and at Kianga in Dec; 25 at Eurobodalla Rd in Jul; no more than 20 at other locations.

Breeding: juveniles at Comerang in Mar. (JC)

DIOMEDEIDAE Albatrosses

Black-browed Albatross Thalassarche melanophris

Status: Vulnerable; common winter pelagic.

Four off South Durras on 22 Feb. (JCof)

PROCELLARIIDAE Petrels, shearwaters.

Shearwater sp.

Four at Mystery Bay in Feb, 1 in Nov; 2 beachcast at Meringo in Nov. (MA/DHK)

Short-tailed Shearwater *Ardenna tenuirostris*

Status: common summer breeding migrant.

Hundreds migrating south off Burrewarra Point on 9 Oct and off Kianga and Narooma on 10 Oct. (GH/T&A Ross)

Common Diving-Petrel *Pelecanoides urinatrix*

Status: occasionally recorded off the coast.

One found dead at Broulee on 9 Oct. (W Platts)

THRESKIORNITHIDAE Ibis, spoonbills.

Yellow-billed Spoonbill *Platalea flavipes*

Status: migrant.

One at Bumbo Rd on 25 Jun and at Coila Lake on 10 Jul. (FM/M Craig)

Royal Spoonbill Platalea regia

Status: common resident.

Up to 40 at Comerang in Mar and at Bumbo Rd in Sep; 27 at Tuross River in Nov; 20 at Narooma in Jul; 15 at Mummaga Lake in Aug; 14 at Mystery Bay in Oct; 13 at Broulee in Aug; no more than 10 at other locations.

Straw-necked Ibis Threskiornis spinicollis

Status: winter-spring migrant and bird of passage.

Up to 80 at Eurobodalla Rd in Jul; 60 at Mystery Bay in Oct; 20 at Comerang in Jan and at Moruya in Nov; no more than 8 at other locations.

Australian White Ibis Threskiornis moluccus

Status: common resident and winter-spring migrant.

Up to 50 at Coila Lake in Oct; 21 at Narooma in Apr; 20 at Broulee in Dec; 16 at Mystery Bay in May; no more than 7 at other locations.

ARDEIDAE Bitterns, herons, egrets.

Nankeen Night Heron Nycticorax caledonicus

Status: uncommon breeding resident.

Two at Bumbo Rd in Jun-Jul and at Batemans Bay Water Gardens in Nov. (FM/MA/J Mather)

Striated Heron *Butorides striata*

Status: uncommon breeding resident.

Two at Coila Lake in Nov; single birds at Moruya in Feb, Bingie in Mar, Narooma in Apr, Tomakin in May, Broulee in May-Jun, Mystery Bay in Jul and Dalmeny in Aug.

Cattle Egret Bubulcus ibis

Status: common autumn-spring migrant.

Recorded Mar-Dec; up to 120 at Eurobodalla Rd in Jul; 70 at Mystery Bay in May; 50 at Moruya in Apr; 40 at Comerang in Jun; 23 at Bergalia in May; no more than 8 at other locations.

White-necked Heron Ardea pacifica

Status: breeding resident.

Five at South Durras in Nov; 4 at Comerang in Mar, 2 in Dec; single birds at 5 other locations.

Great Egret Ardea alba

Status: common resident.

Up to 12 at Mystery Bay in Aug, 6 in Jun-Jul; 6 at Comerang in Dec; 5 at Narooma in Oct; 3 at Moruya in May, at Broulee in Aug and Oct, at South Head, Moruya in Sep and at South Durras in Nov; no more than 2 at other locations.

Intermediate Egret Ardea intermedia

Status: uncommon migrant.

Two at Moruya in May, 1 in Sep; 1 at Comerang in Mar-May, at Narooma in Aug, at Broulee in Oct and at Nangudga in Nov.

White-faced Heron Egretta novaehollandiae

Status: common breeding resident.

Widely reported in all months; 45 at Bumbo Rd in Sep; 25 at South Durras in Feb; 22 at Comerang in

Dec; 9 at Broulee in Aug; 8 at Coolagolite in Aug; no more than 6 at other locations.

Breeding: juveniles at Comerang in Mar. (JC)

Little Egret Egretta garzetta

Status: common resident.

Ten at Nangudga in Apr-May; 8 at Narooma in Aug; 6 at Mystery Bay in Jun; 1 or 2 at 7 other locations.

Eastern Reef Egret Egretta sacra

Status: resident.

Two at Bingie in Feb; single birds at 6 other locations during the year.

PELICANIDAE Pelican.

Australian Pelican Pelecanus conspicillatus

Status: common resident.

Reported in all months; 30 at Coila Lake in Oct-Nov; 25 at Mystery Bay in May; 12 at Comerang in Apr and Sep; no more than 6 at other locations.

SULIDAE Gannets, boobies.

Australasian Gannet *Morus serrator*

Status: common winter migrant and bird of passage.

Up to 10 at Meringo in Jul and at Broulee in Aug; 8 at Jemisons Point in Apr; 7 at South Durras in Mar; no more than 5 at other locations.

PHALACROCORACIDAE Cormorants.

Little Pied Cormorant *Microcarbo melanoleucos*

Status: common breeding resident.

Widely reported in all months; 40 at Coila Lake in Nov; 20 at Bingie in Sep; 15 at South Durras in Feb, at Mystery Bay in Mar, at Bumbo Rd in Jun and at Broulee in Aug; 10 at Meringo in Jul; no more than 8 at other locations.

Great Cormorant *Phalacrocorax carbo*

Status: common resident.

Up to 100 at Mystery Bay in Oct, at Moruya, Meringo and South Head, Moruya in Nov; 30 at Coila Lake in Nov; 20 at Comerang in Nov; 15 at South Durras in Jan; no more than 4 at other locations.

Little Black Cormorant Phalacrocorax sulcirostris

Status: common resident.

Up to 70 at South Durras in Nov; 60 at Narooma in Nov; 30 at Comerang in Nov; 21 at Broulee in Jun; 8 at South Durras in Feb; no more than 4 at other locations.

Great Pied Cormorant *Phalacrocorax varius*

Status: uncommon resident.

Four at Coila Lake in Nov; 2 at Brou Lake in Feb and at Kianga in May; 1 at Corunna Lake in Feb and at Bergalia in Sep.

ANHINGIDAE Darter.

Australasian Darter Anhinga novaehollandiae

Status: breeding resident.

Two at Comerang in Apr and at South Durras in Aug-Sep and Nov; single birds at 5 other locations during the year.

BURHINIDAE Stone curlews

Beach Stone-curlew *Esacus magnirostris*

Status: Critically Endangered; vagrant.

Two at Brou Lake on 14 Oct; 1 at Lilli Pilli in Aug and at South Durras on 7 Oct. (DB/M Fleming)

HAEMATOPODIDAE Oystercatchers.

Australian Pied Oystercatcher *Haematopus longirostris*

Status: Endangered; breeding resident.
